BRACKETTSVILLE, Dec. 15., !73. Editor Express:

No doubt the news of the Indian fight has already reached you, how-ever I cannot torbear giving you a few tacts additional to what you may have learned concerning this really brilliant engagement. Lieut. Hudson "Co. 1" 4th Cavalry sta-tioned at Ft. Clard, left here with a detachment of forty men on the 4th inst., and when thirty-seven miles north west of here, or twelve miles north west of Kickapoo springs, found some forty unbranded ponies in a cedar break which had evidently been left there by the party of Comanches, who were depredating

in the lower country recently, they were taken and sent to Ft Clark, and the Lieutenant remained at the cedar break believing the Indians would return for their ponies, and every precaution was taken meanwhile that sound judgment and foresight could dictate. A sentinel was posted in the identical lookout which the indians had occupied and the only two other passes that the Indians could take were carefully watched, On the morning of the 10th the detachment moved some six miles from camp towards a large pond near where it was conjectured the Indiaus must pass, when on the top of a high hill some two miles distant the Indiaus with a heard were descried, they discovered the troops about the same instant and stopped and dismounting began

preparations for a fight. They were about torty-live strong, armed as subsequently proved, with win-chesters and army carbines. They formed a regular skirmish line pro teeted by the dense scrubby growth on the crest of the hill. When Lieut. Hudson had ridden to within four hundred yards, the Indians opened fire, the men commenced to return it, but were checked by the Lieutepant who rode to within seventy five yards of the Indians, then dismonnted the men, and form-ing in line opened fire and volly after volly succeeded, outil the Indians mounting retreated, when a miles ensued. The country was rocky and broken tull a ravins and hollows and availing themselves of this, the Indians scattering were

But one soldier was wounded in the leg and not badly. 
