Editor Express : On the 29th of October last Mr. J. D. Burgess, an extensive farmer on the Rio Grande, in the vicinity of Presidio del Norte, had a diffi-culty with some Mexicans living on his farm about some corn they were his farm about some corn they were gathering, when without a moments warning he was fired upon by a party of Mexicans, concealed in the chapparal, two shots took effect, one cutting off a piece of his ear, making quite a painful would on the side of his head, the other grazing him across the small of his back. him across the small of his back-slightly breaking the skin-; being accompanied by two of his sons and as usual well armed, he made tight with his assailants, and soon suc-ceeded in killing two and wounding two others (one of whom died next day) when the rest fled. The most intense excitement prevailed on the other side when the news was received that a bated "Griugo" had the audacity to kill, in their immediate vicinity, three of the sons the sacred land of God and Liberty, even in defence of his own life. against the lives of Mr. B. and his family, and they would undoubtedly have attemted to wreak venge suce that night, had not an officer with some troops opportunely arrived from this place; Mr. Burgess

not feeling very secure, came here on the rearn of the troops, and reported the facts to the commanding officer.

On the 26th of last month w large party of Mexicaus crossed over at night to destroy Burgess and his sons, well provided with turpintine and other things of an (enitable and other things of an ignituble nature to burn down his farm house (or ranch - which is impregnable to small arms,) but finding that he had fied to Ft. Davis, they were influenced to return by some Mexicans living on his place; in the place of this armed invasion Colonel Blies, the commanding officer here, immede-ately sent an Officer and some Cavairy over there to prevent, it possible, a like occurrence; the Caval ry has since been relieved by a Company of Infantry, which are at present stationed there and with whom Mr. Burgess returned to his home. During the stay of the Cavalry at del Norte-parties of thieves crossed the river and stole every head of eattle from the rauch es of Messrs, Smith & Tinkham, living about 25 miles from the river, and crossed them into Mexico as the Cavalry were too few to do any

scouting Another party of thieves attack ed the train (rumour says are still pursuing it,) of Mr. August Santleben of your place for the purpose of robbing it, as he takes \$140,000 specie from Chibnabua, and would have succeeded, had it not been for the personal bravery of Mr. S. who with his sixteen shooter made it rather too hot for them. Mr. S. was attacked about ten miles from the Custom House on this side, so your merchants must be cautious in transporting their merchandize and


