Washington, Dec. 18.—The salary bill passed by the House was referred to the Committee on Retrenchment.

Whiting, which had been assigned by the United States government to the duty of receiving the surrender of the Virginius, sailed from Key West Sunday evening, and arrived in the harbor of Bahia Honda the next marning, where she found the Virginius in charge of the Spanish aloop-of-war La Favarita, Senor De la Camara commanding. Shortly after noon the latter came on bord the Dis Whiting for the surrender at nine o'clock Treeday morning. His visit was returned later in the day by Captain Whiting. Their intercourse was of the most courteous character. Tuesday the weather was bright and clear. The only specta tors to the scene about to take place were the men or the Dispatch and La Pavorith, and some rag ged and dirty Cubans in fishing smacks, apparently intent on fishing alone. As the latter stepped on deck, a petty officer and half a dexer men a he had steed watch on the Virginia during negotiations went over the side and remained in the dingey awaiting orders. Panetually, as the bells on the Die patch struck for 9, and before they had died away, the American flag was hoisted same moment a boat containing Captain Whiting and Lieutenant Mariox put away from the Dispatch. As they seconded the accommodation ladder of the Virginius, a single man on deck, who proved to be Sener De la Camara, advanced and made a conrieous salute. The officer then read their respective instructions and Capt. Whiting accepted, and ascertaining that a receipt would be acceptable, gave one.
