



Incidents of Election.

And this is what Democracy calls a free country and a free election! We call it the most abhorrent despotism we ever have suffered under, the most abominable oligarchy, a fraud on the citizens and a shame for every free man!

It is a well known experience that every revolution naturally degrades the victors as well as the vanquished, but in Spain really as degraded as fresh powers are to be compelled to grasp behind the old regime? Ferrero has, in the late history of Spain at different times appeared on the public stage, but he has always played his role badly! He is perfectly outwitted. He cannot become the Hercules of Spain.
