Death of Another Tecumseh Willer.

[Special Dispatch to the Chicago Tribune] TOLEDO, O., March 20.

Peter Navarre, the most distingnished of the scouts who served on the American side during the war of 1812, in the operations of the different armies of the Northwest, died here to-day, at the age of eighty vine. He, his four brothers, the Strawnee Chief Logan and Maj. Win. Oliver were the scouting party upon which the different armies depended at all times. They succeeded in escaping at Hull's surrender, made their way to Harrison's headquarters, and returning, succeeded in making their way into the be leaguered Fort Wayne with intelligence which prevented that strong hold from falling into the hands of Tecumseh. Peter Navarre was pres ent at the massacre of River Raisin, a disaster be had vainly attempted to prevent by his urgent entreaties to Gen. Winchester. After seeing that the day was lost, and be and his brothers escaped by concealing After over Forty Years' trial it is still themselves under the banks of the river. During the siege of Fort Meigs he and one brother succeeded est character and responsibility, Eminent in passing the lines of the British and Indians after five futile attempt had been made to send dispatches for assistance. He participated in the battle of the Thames, in Col. R. M. Johnson's command, and was one of the claimants to the honor ot killing Tecumseh. If he did not kill him, he at least burried him, being one of those sent by Gen. Harrison to identify and burry Tecumseh's body. So highly was Na varre's value to the Americans esteemed by the British that Gen. Proctor issued a formal order from Malden, offering a reward of \$1,000 for his scalp. After the war closed Navarre returned to a little piece of ground at the mouth of the bay, which he became possessed of, and has since resided there, eking out a scanty living from it, since be had all of the pioneer aversions to regular argriculture, and as a farmer was not a conspicuous suc

In Smyrna, Asia, the weather was unusually severe the latter part of last month. Snow fell to the depth of nearly a foot, a spectacle that had not been witnessed there within twenty-eight years. It is said to have formed an exquisitely beautiful landscape scene, when the orange trees, with their golden fruit, were covered with a layer of snow; and the young generation did not know what to make of it at all. Even the animals and wild fowl were astonished, and, frightened by the usual cold and snow store fled from their forest and meadow retreats, into the city, where hundreds of partridges and snipes were killed by improvised sportsmen. As few of the houses in Smyrna are furnished with stoves or grates, the inhabitants spent a very uncomfortable time during the cold spell.

The bill disorganizing Kinney Co. was introduced by Russell of Brownsville or as he is more familiarly known as necessity Russell, and in this case he was certainly a necessity, for I dont suppose any man in the State of Texas shows a more brazen effrontery and shameless disregard of common decency under the veil of hippocricy and quite of dissimulation, than this same Russell, possessing neither talents nor legislative ability, he de pends for success on load braying, sour look, repulsive aspect and threatening gestures, and with all these unemiable qualities he seldom excites the attention of his audience. It was necessity and absolute necessity alone that induced the people of the 30th district to send such a character to represent them in the legislative halls. However this being Russell's pet scheme and being made partisan in its character, it was rushed through the Senate with lightning speed on the 6th of February and sent to the House as quick as feet could carry it. Here it was referred to the Committee on Counties and County Boundaries before which Russell appeared with a petition purporting to be signed by 15 or 20 residents. of Kinney Co. who were asking to be relieved from the oppression and despotism of Kinney Co. officials. In his arguments before the Committee Russell meeting with opposition of Florence O'Haggarty, a delegate from Kinney Co., sent to protect the interests of his County, Russell adopted the same loud braying, sour looks, repulsive aspects and threatening gesture (which he usually wears when discussing in the Senate) with a view of searing O'Haggarty in to silence, but O'Haggarty who is charged in the petition with being an Allen, and with holding several County, State and federal positions and some "other high crimes and misdemeaners," not being scared and determined to fight the tigers in their den, denied every allegation contained in the petition, and affered a counter petition signed by over one hundred voters of his County in corroboration of his statement and showing the organization and perfect and harmonions working of their County machinery. O'Haggarty offered to back up this statement under oath and demanded as a right that persons and papers be sent for, but dis egarding his testimony, his pleas and his just demands, and blinded by partisans prejudice with an eye single to the destruction of the republican element throughout the State, the passage of the bill was recommended, and reported accordingly. 
