It is demonstrated by statistics that the manufacture of domestic liquors was carried on half a century ago to a much greater extent in proportion to the population than it is to day. WASHINGTON, April 2.-Senator Wadeigh succeeds Sumner on Committee on Privileges and Elections.

A DISGRACEFUL piece of mischief is reported from Berlin, where some idiot has, it seems, been amusing himself by poisoning a good many of the most valuable animals in the Zoological Gardens. His last victims are six bears, two jaguars, lynx, all of which have died, with the exception of the male jaguar and the female panther. These, however, are net the only losses sustained. Within the last few weeks several valuable carnivora have perished, and their death being at tributed to feeding on the flesh of horses possibly suffering from disease. The food given to the animals has since been carefully cooked, so that wilfull poisoning appears to be the only explanation of the recent deaths among them. The Director of the Zoological Garden Company have offered a reward of one thousand thalers for the apprehension of the miscreant. 

Brewers of 500 barrels or more..... 100.00 Any person, so liable, who shall fail to comply with the foregoing requirements will be subject to severe penalties.
