**Boarding Madame Nilsson.**  
 A New York letter to the Boston Saturday Gazette says:

Madame Nilsson-Rouzeau has changed her quarters from the Clarendon to the Windsor Hotel. She suddenly took the notion into her head, and without as much as "by your leave" to Mr. Strakosch, who loots the hotel bills, and might, therefore, be supposed to have some interest. Nilsson is a willful creature, and extravagant, too, with other people's money. Mr. Strakosch's contract with her is that he shall pay all her expenses. That includes hotel bill for self, husband, man servant, and maid servant, horse and carriage, amounting to \$300 a week. She has always boarded at the Clarendon until this freak for living at the Windsor took possession of her. It was Mr. Strakosch's bargain to pay her expenses at a "first class" hotel; and no one can deny but that the Clarendon meets every requirement in that respect. You would scarcely believe the items that Mme. Nilsson has on her bill for Mr. Strakosch to pay: There is washing, newspapers and postage stamps, all charged to him. Whether Nilsson acknowledges any personal expenses at all is a question. She has already received for services, this year, \$64,000 in gold, so one would suppose that she might keep herself in postage stamps. During a recent visit to Philadelphia, the orchestra of the troupe thought they would give the prima donna a serenad; it would be a good advertisement and let the people know that Mme. Nilsson had really arrived in town. They came and played under her window at the Continental, and were invited in to champagne by the fair cantatrice, and they drank and were merry. The next day Strakosch received a bill of \$20 for champagne. While out in Chicago, Nilsson wanted to attend the theater; so she took a box and a carriage, and invited her friends, and sent the bill to Mr. Strakosch. No wonder that she has made money and Strakosch has lost. His expenses have been \$300,000, and hers nothing. That he is poorer today by \$10,000 than the day he opened here last fall is not surprising to those who know the ins and outs of the business. Mme. Nilsson has nothing to do with her money but to bank it or speculate with it. When his friends have expostulated with Mr. Strakosch for paying Nilsson's ridiculous demands, he would reply that it was only a few dollars, and that he would rather pay it than have the row that would ensue if he should refuse. It is unfortunate that an artist with Nilsson's reputation should have such smallness. It may be that having been elevated from want to luxury, she has not even yet gotten quite used to the easy way she can make money, which makes her as careful of pennies as she should be of the pounds.

A paper in Nebraska, under the head of "An Hour With Our Business Men," describes two saloons, and ends the item with the remark: "This completes the round of the business houses on the public square." It is needless to remark that the temperance movement has not yet made its appearance there.

Rhode Island and Connecticut, in quick succession, are to follow New Hampshire in State elections. A squabble over the senatorship is a disturbing influence, in Rhode Island, while affairs seem to be progressing well in Connecticut. In a week or two we shall know the results in both States.  
 Chinese oil beans, remarkable for the amount of protein matter and oil they contain, are but little used as food for man, but are cultivated mainly as feed for cattle and for fertilizing. The ripe beans, as well as oil cake, are fed; the oil cake also serving as a manure for sugar cane and mulberry trees. The oil, expressed as usual by wedges, has a honey yellow tint, and a rather delicate and pleasant odor, and is quite fluid. It may be used as a table oil, or for illumination, without previous purification. In China, a clay soil, which is well fertilized with bone and wood ashes, with the addition of the sediment of the numerous canals: seems best adapted to the cultivation of the oil beans. The stalks need no support. The harvest occurs in Octo-

ber, when the beans are trampled out, and the straw utilized as fuel.

Why is it that the youngest and handsomest ladies are always successful with saloon-keepers?—Boston Post. 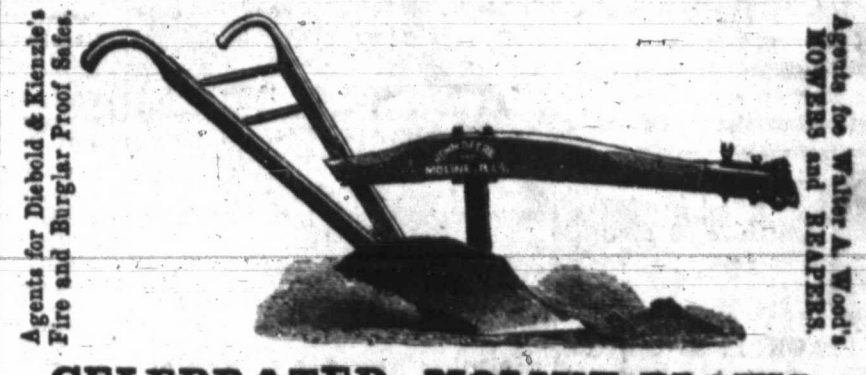
