The Theater in France.

The theater absorbs much of the
 literary talent in France, this de-
 partment being more lucrative than
 any other. The playwrights of
 Paris, during the representation of
 one of their plays, receive from ten
 to twelve per cent on the gross re-
 ceipts, which vary from three to
 seven thousand francs a night.

Taking five thousand as an average,
 ten per cent. would give to the
 author 500 francs, or \$100, per
 night. Other terms, a trifle lower,
 exist for the provincial theaters,
 regulated and enforced by the Soci-
 ete des Auteurs Dramatiques et
 Compositeurs de Musique. Thus
 the author is sometimes in receipt
 of his per centage from several
 theaters at the same time. He is
 also the recipient of a small profit
 from the sale of the printed play.

The author of the one act farce with
 which the performance usually be-
 gins receives two per cent. of the
 whole receipts, ten being for the
 author of the principal piece. M.
 Sardou's plays are generally of such
 length that they do not admit of
 the farce, hence he is paid the
 twelve per cent. the amount al-
 lowed for the whole evening's per-
 formance. The privilege is only
 accorded to two or three of the
 most successful authors. M. Sardou
 has made from his plays as much
 as \$40,000 a year.

It is now a much more lucrative
 business than formerly. Scribe,
 who is cited as the most successful
 playwright of his time, received for
 one of his pieces in 1812 one hun-
 dred francs, 1816 one hundred and
 fifty for another entitled "L'Ecole
 de Village" and two hundred for
 the "Comte Ory," in 1818 four hun-
 dred for the "Visite a Bedlam," and
 three thousand for "Valerie." The

price continued to advance until, in
 1834, he was paid twenty thousand
 francs for the "Passion Secrete,"
 which was considered, at that time,
 something fabulous in the way of
 remuneration. The "Menteur" of
 Corneille probably never reached
 such a figure as this. M. Sardou
 realizes from a popular play some-
 thing in the neighborhood for one
 hundred and fifty thousand francs
 —30,000.

The dramatic authors of France
 are indebted for the prices they now
 receive in a great measure to the
 existence of the association into
 which they have formed themselves
 —La Societe des Auteurs Dramati-
 ques et Compositeurs de Musique,
 which is much like trades union—
 advancing the interests and defend-
 ing the rights of each individual
 member. Naturally all the play-
 wrights of France are members of
 this association the affairs of which
 are managed by a selected commit-
 tee of fifteen, the committee ap-
 pointed two of their number as
 president and secretary.—Albert
 Blodes, in the Galaxy for April.

**Marrying in Switzerland a Se-
 rious Matter.**
 It appears to be no easy matter
 to get married in Switzerland. A
 citizen of Schaffhausen, who had
 removed to another canton, asked
 from his commune the necessary
 permission to marry. The presi-
 dent of the commune, in reply, told
 him that, in addition to payment
 for the needful documents, he would
 have to provide for the rights of
 bourgeoisie if his fiancés were a
 Swiss, 200 francs if a foreigner.
 The man was told, moreover, that
 he would have to provide by certifi-
 cate that he was provided with a
 wedding outfit and fortune of 800
 francs. He would be required to
 pay, in addition, 23 francs to the
 school fund, 20 francs for the mili-
 tary tax of 1873, and 30 florins 12
 krentzer for expenses incurred by
 his commune when he was ill in
 Germany. The claims thus amount-
 ed to 333 francs 40 centimes, irre-
 spective of all other expenses of
 permissions, translations, stamps,
 and the cost of documents. The
 man was totally unable to meet this
 claim, and representations to this
 effect were made to the council of
 his commune by a society for en-
 couraging marriages, but all their
 efforts are useless.

Synagogues at Home.
 There are five synagogues in
 Rome, two of which belong to the
 Spanish and the remainder to the
 Italian rite. They are called Scuola
 del Tempio, which is said to have
 existed at Rome since the time of
 Titus, Catalana, Castillano, Sizia-
 no, and Scuola Nova. All these

synagogues are in one building, but
 they all have separate entrances
 from different streets. The reason
 of this is that the Inquisition would
 only allow one synagogue in Rome,
 and it was only with great difficulty
 and by means of a lavish expen-
 diture of money that permission
 was obtained to retain the rest on
 condition that they should all be
 lodged in the same building. The
 Talmud was on the Index of the
 Inquisition, and none of the syna-
 gogues were allowed to have even
 a single copy of it. There are al-
 together 4,500 Jews in Rome, most
 of whom are in a destitute condi-
 tion.

Editor Express:
 Sir—It may be absurd for one of "low
 degree" in political circles to even pretend
 to criticize the acts of the august body,
 who assemble daily on Capitol Hill to
 enact laws for the good of their constitu-
 ents; yet there are some things lately
 come into notice that will hardly bear
 criticism, even from the merest tyro.

There is a large number of citizens of this
 county who have settled upon vacant
 land under the "Homestead act," which
 insures them a patent for the land by
 their compliance with that act, viz: three
 years settlement and improvement, and
 paying Surveyors fees, etc. But along
 comes the "economical" 14th with its
 retrenchment and reform, and orders each
 homestead assessed as taxable property;
 land belonging to the State is taxed, and
 that in direct non-compliance with the
 contract entered into by the State with
 the settler. Of course the amount will
 not be much on each survey, but the idea
 of the obligation entered into by the State
 cannot the settler to doubt the integrity
 of the same.

Another and the only imposition, that I
 shall notice at present is the taxation of
 fire arms. In the older settled parts of
 the State not subject to Indian raids it
 would perhaps be well enough; but upon
 the frontier where every light moon they
 are expected, it is a shame. If they had
 made an appropriation for the purchase of
 improved fire-arms for the arming of every
 man upon the frontier they would not only
 have enjoyed the favor of every patriot,
 but would have greatly benefited the
 State at large. Unless some of their ob-
 noxious acts are repealed their chances for
 re-election will be as slim as that of their
 predecessors of the 13th. This seems to be
 the general feeling irrespective of party,
 and the hardy pioneer of West Texas
 when once aroused, is not quick to bury
 the memory of his wrongs. May the day
 soon come when we will be cut off into
 a State of our own, for then and not till
 then will West Texas receive her rights at
 the hands of her legislators.

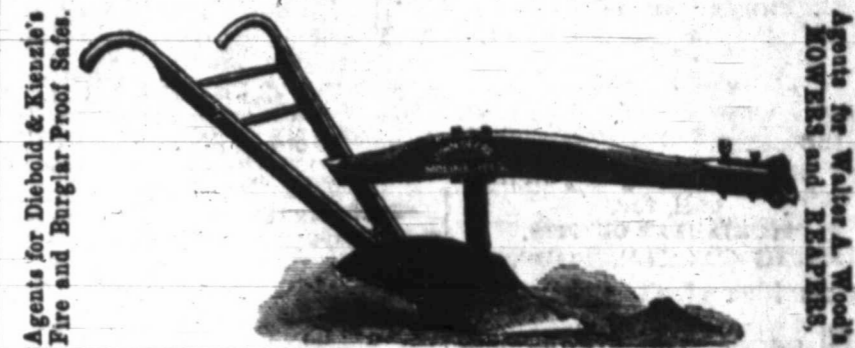


