LAW OF THE UNITED STATES, PASSED AT THE FIRST SESSION OF THE FORTY-THIRD CONGRESS.

[GENERAL NATURE—No. 19.] AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to encourage the growth of timber on western prairies."

## The International Road.

It is very probable that the International Bill, already passed the Senate, will become a law of the land. The fact that Mr. Moody, the financial agent of the State, has made the discovery that the course pursued by the 13th Legislature toward the International has utterly prostrated Texas credit abroad will have much to do in causing the 14th Legislature to perform this anticipated act of partial justice to the West.

It is proposed to give the International a little over half of the amount honestly due the Company on condition the road is completed to San Antonio, provided, however, the Supreme Court render a decision in the Bledsoe case, now pending before it, declaring the subsidy constitutional.

The question very naturally arises: Why does not the present Comptroller remedy the evil brought about by his predecessor Mr. Bledsoe's official career being closed, least as far as the present administration is concerned? There would then be no necessity of awaiting the tardy decision of the Supreme Court. But it seems there is a yearning on the part of somebody to make this a test case before the Supreme Court, and as usual the West has to furnish the corpse for dissection.

But supposing the Supreme Court decides the subsidy to be constitutional will not that decision restore to the International all the rights and claims it obtained from the 12th Legislature. The Legislature has no legal right to violate the Constitution that so plainly says no laws shall be passed impairing the obligations and rights of contract between parties.

Our Trans Colorado brethren may, however, rely upon it that the West, irrespective of party, will not stand much more nonsense about this matter. No matter what the political complexion of a Texas Legislature may be there has heretofore been no deviation from the rule, that is, to rob and oppress the West to the profit of the East.

This has been the settled policy for the last twenty years.

Our share of the school fund, our hard earned taxes, by means of sectional legislation have been expended in covering the East with a net work of railroads. Nearly a thousand miles of railroad have been built in the State, mostly with the money of the tax payers of the whole State, yet only ninety odd miles of road are on this side of the Colorado.

We believe the time is at hand for the West to protest more effectively than with mere threats of DIVISION against being systematically treated as if our people were sheep to be shorn and dogs to be kicked.

## The Temperance Move.

The indications are that the Dio Lewis and the praying women are about over their little spree, so to speak. They may now retire from public notice with the happy consciousness of having surrounded themselves with an imperishable halo of absurdity. Dio Lewis, and other clerical idiots, (whose lunacy has the merit, however, of bringing bread into their otherwise empty stomachs) are probably the only ones that have made both ends meet during the campaign.

We wonder if it even occurred to these pious stumblers, while they were emptying their shallow souls of its unsavory sediment, that the only two men saved from the Deluge and the destruction of Sodom were conspicuous for their efforts "in making drunk come."

## Telegraphic.

WASHINGTON, April 14.—The substitute for Sumner's civil rights bill, reported by the Judiciary Committee to-day, provides that all persons within the jurisdiction of the United States shall be entitled to have the enjoyment and privileges of inns, public conveyances on land or water, theatres and other places of public amusement, and also of common schools and public institutions of learning or benevolence, supported in a whole or in part by general taxation, and of cemeteries so supported, subject only to conditions and limitations established by law and applicable alike to citizens of every race and color regardless of any previous condition of servitude. Any person denying to any citizen any of the privileges conferred by this bill shall pay \$500 dollars to the person aggrieved, and shall also be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$500 nor more than \$1000, or be imprisoned not less than thirty days nor more than one year. The district and circuit courts of the United States are given exclusive control of the several States concerning all offenses to the bill, and actions may be prosecuted in any United States court, whenever a defendant may be found guilty, without regard to any other party. Any district attorney who shall willfully refuse to prosecute the proceedings required, shall, for every such offense, forfeit and pay the sum of \$500 to the person aggrieved, and upon conviction thereof shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be fined not less than \$1000 nor more than \$5000. No citizen shall be disqualified for service as grand or petit juror in any State or United States court on account of race, color or previous condition of servitude, and any officer who shall exclude or fail to summon a citizen for that cause shall be fined not more than \$5000. All cases arising under this act may be renewed by the Supreme Court of the United States.

WASHINGTON, April 14.—Senator Flanagan presented a petition from C. D. Anderson, of Texas, for the removal of his political disabilities. Referred to Judiciary Committee.

NEW ORLEANS, April 14.—The river has risen about three inches. It is now 5 to 7 inches above the high water mark of 1871. The water is over the levees at the head of Orange street, and over a foot deep on the Mobile Railroad track from Jefferson str. to the lower end of the fruit market. The McCullom's and Bonnet Carre levees are both regarded as beyond control. Nothing can likely be done with them until the river falls 10 or 15 feet. Gov. Kellogg to-day addressed a circular to all police juries in the river parishes, saying the exigencies were beyond all provided means to control the threatened overflow and advising them to go to work, build up and protect the levees in their respective parishes, promising to recommend the next Legislature to reimburse parishes for moneys expended.

NEW YORK, April 14.—Capt. Lamarie, of the Europe, states: "The vessel was recently lengthened, refitted and supplied with new boilers and machinery. This was her fifth voyage since she was repaired. While coming out of Havre she scraped her bottom against the stones, but I did not believe the damage, if any, was serious. I was confirmed in my impressions when I reached Brest two days afterwards and found the vessel all right. On the 3d day at sea the chief mate reported to me that he observed considerable water coming into the engine room, and had no idea where it came from, except from the ship's bottom. I found on investigation that it was there the leak occurred. The pumps were vigorously applied, but without avail, as the water poured in more rapidly than we could discharge it. The following day we sighted the Greece and put up signals of distress. The Greece came up lowered her boats, and in two hours our passengers and crew were transferred from the Europe."

EARLY in February three millions of people were dependent on the East Indian authorities for food. To get supplies for such an immense multitude has been no easy task, but when they are collected, the want of good roads and the means of transportation, anything nothing of stormy weather and other domestic difficulties, renders the work a relief slow and in many respects unsatisfactory. By strenuous exertion much has been done, however, and at latest accounts the number of the worst sufferers had been reduced to about half a million. The remaining distress is very great, but the situation is far brighter than it was a few weeks ago.

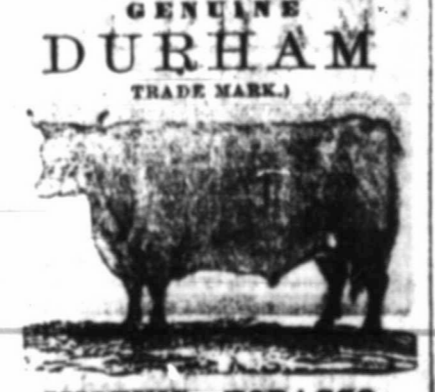

Peddlers of tobacco, fourth class (on  
foot or public conveyance)..... 10.00

procure the Special Tax Stamp or Stamps
