FIRST SESSION OF THE FOR-TY THIRD CONGRESS.

GENERAL NATURE-No. 19.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to encenrage the growth of timber on western prairies.".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of American in Congress assembled, That the act entitled "An act to encourage the growth of timber on western prairies," as proved March third, eighteen hundred and seven ty-three, be, and the same is hereby, amended so as to read as follows: That any person who is the head of a family or who has arrived at the age of twenty-one years, and is a citizen of the United States, ore who shall have filed his declaration of intention to become such, as required by the naturalization laws of the United States who shall plant, protect, and keep in a healthy, growing condition for eight years, forty acres of timber, the trees thereon not being more than twelve feet apart each way, on any quarter section of any of the public lands of the United States, or twenty acres on any legal subdivision of eighty acres, or ten acres on any legal subdivision of forty acres, or one fourth part of any fractional subdivision of land less than forty acres, shall be entitled to a patent for the whole of said quarter-section, or of such legal subdivision of eighty or forty acres, or freeas the case may be, at the expiration said eight years. on making proof of such fact by not less than two credible witnesses: Provided, That not more than one quarter of any section shall thus be granted, and that no person shall make more than one entry under the previsions of ess than forty acres are entered which, in the aggregate, shal not exceed one quarter-

SEC. 2. That the person applying for the benefit of this act shall, upon application to the register of the land-district in which he or she is about to make such entry, make affidavit before the register, or the 6-12-71dtf. minister oaths in the district where the land is situated, who is required by law to use an official seal, that said entry is made for the cultivation of timber, and upon filing said affidavit with said register said receiver, and on payment of ten doilars, he or she shall thereupon be permit-ted to enter the quantity of land specified; and the party making an entry of a quar ter-section under the provisions of this act shall be required to break ten acres of the land covered thereby the first year, ten acres the second year, and twenty acres the third year after date of entry and to plant ten acres of timber the second year, ten acres the third year, and twenty acres the fourth year after date of eutry. A party making an entry of eighty aeres shall break and plant at the times herinbefore prescribed, one half of tee quantity required of a party who enters a quarter-section, and a party entering forty acres shall break and plant, at the times hereinbefore prescribed, one-quarter of the quantity for any smaller fractional subdivision: Provided, however, That no final certificate shall be given or patent issued for the land so entered until the expiration of eight years from the date of such entry; and, if at the expiration of such time, or at any time within five

The International Road.

It is very probable that the Iu ternational Bill, already passed the Senate, will become a law of the land. The fact that Mr. Moody, the financial agent of the State, has made the discovery that the course pursued by the 13th Legislature toward the International has atterly prostrated Texas credit abroad will have much to do in causing the 14th Legislature to perform this auticipated act of partial justice to the West.

It is proposed to give the Internation a little over half of the amount honestly due the Company on condition the road is completed to San Antonio, provided, however, the Supreme Court render a decision in the Bledsoe case, now pending before it, declaring the subsidy constitutional.

The question very naturally ar rises: Why does not the present Comptroller remedy the evil brought about by his predecessor Mr. Bledsoe's official carreer being closed, least as far as the present administration is concerned?" There would then be no necessity of await ing the tardy decision of the Supreme Court. But it seems there is a yearning on the part of somebody to make this a test case before the Supreme Court, and as usual the West has to furnish the corpse

But supposing the Supreme Court decides the subsidy to be constitutional will not that decision restore to the International all the rights and claims it obtained from the 12th Legislature. The Legislature has no legal right to violate the Constitution that so plainly says no laws shall be passed imparing the ebligations and rights of contract ing parties.

Our Trans Colorado bretheren may, however, rely upon it that the West, irrespective of party, will not this matter. No matter what the political complexion of a Texas Legislature may be there has heretofore been no deviation from the rule, that is, to rob and oppress the West to the profit of the East,

This has been the settled policy for the last twenty years.

Our share of the school fund, our hard earned taxes, by means of sectional legislation have been expended in covering the East with a net work of railroads. Nearly a with the money of the tax payers of the whole State, yet only ninety edd miles of road are on this side of the Colorado.

We believe the time is at hand for the West to protest more effectually than with mere threats of DIVISION against being systematieally treated as if our people were sheep to be shorn and dogs to be kicked. .

WASHINGTON April 14.—The substitute for Sumner's civil rights bill, reported by the Judiciary Committee to-day, provides that all persons within the jurisdiction of the United States shall be entitled to have the enjoyment and privileges of inns, publie conveyances on land or water, thestres and other places of public amusement, and also of common schools and public institutions of learning or benevolence, supported in a whole or in part by general taxation, and of cometries so suprorted, subject only to conditions and limitations established by law and applicable alike to citizens of every race and color regardless of any previous condition of servitude. Any person denying to any citizen any of the privileges conferred by this bill shall pay 500 dellars to the person aggravated, and shall also be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$500 nor more than \$1000, or be imprisoned not less than thirty days nor more than one year. The district and circuit courts of the United States are given exclusive control of the several States concerning all offenses to the bill, and actions may be prosecuted in any United States court, whenever a defendant may be found guilty, without regard to any other party. Any district attorney who shall willfully refuse to prosecute the proceedings required, shall, for every such effense, forfeit and pay the sum of \$500 to the person aggravated, and upon conviction therest shall be guilty of a misdemearor, and shall be fined not less than \$1000 per more than \$5000. No citizen shall be disqualified for service as grand or petit juror in any State or United States court on account of race, color or previous condition of servitude, and any officer who shall exclude or fail to summon a citizen for that cause shall be fixed not more than \$5000, " All cases arising under this act may be renewed by the Supreme Court of the United States.

WASHINGTON, April 14-Senate-Senator Flanagau presented a petition from C. D. Anderson, of Texas, for the removal of his political disabilities. Referred to Judiciary Committee.

NEW ORLEANS, April 14 .- The river has risen about three inches. It is now 5 to 7 inches above the high water mark of 1871. The water is over the levee at the head of Orange street, and over a foot deep on the Mobile Railroadftrack from Jefferson str. to the lower end of the fruit market. The McCullom's and Bonnet Carre crevasses are both regarded as beyond scontrol. Nothing can likely be done with them until the river falls 10 or 15 feet. Gov. 
