Bismarck's Prosecution of Catholic Prelates
 The arrest of the Archbishop of Cologne will be likely to hasten the civil action of the German Government for the active prosecution by trial of the many prelates and members of the minor clergy of the Roman Catholic Church who are held in arrest, charged with violations of the ecclesiastical laws of the empire. The trial of the Archbishop of Posen was set down to commence with a judicial interrogatory in April, and it is believed that the Archbishop of Cologne and the Bishops of Munster and Breslau will be placed at the bar soon after the result of the first judicial experiment is made known. The furniture of the Bishop of Munster has been sold by auction, and realized the sum of forty-seven thalers, or about \$35 50, and almost all the great Westphalian nobles have placed their houses at his disposal. The Prince Bishop of Breslau has no intention of withdrawing into the Austrian part of the diocese, as has been alleged, and, on the other hand, the Prussian Government is to proceed against the Archbishop of Olmutz, in Moravia, for the appointment of priests in the Silesian part of that diocese, and will stop the fines out of the Prussian portion of its revenues. Nor is the Prussian prosecution at all confined to the bishops who appoint priests. The priests appointed also come in for their share; the parish priest of Anclam, in Pomerania, is in prison, and two young curates appointed in Danzig have been sent to serve in the army. The crusade against the Catholics Association is being kept up; and a government official at Neuwied has ordered a search among the papers of Count Alfred Stolberg-Stolberg, who happens to be a deputy to the Prussian Parliament, and who has complained to the Chamber of this violation of an article of the constitution and of parliamentary privilege. The Chamber has stopped the proceedings, and ordered an inquire as to who is responsible for them.—N. Y. Herald.

LAW
OF THE
UNITED STATES,
 PASSED AT THE
FIRST SESSION OF THE FOR-
TY-THIRD CONGRESS.

[GENERAL NATURE—No. 16.]
 AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to encourage the growth of timber on western prairie."
 [Concluded.]
 SEC. 5. That no land acquired under the provision of this act shall in any event become liable to the satisfaction of any debt or debts contracted prior to the issuing of certificate therefor.
 SEC. 6. That the Commissioner of the General Land Office is hereby required to prepare and issue such rules and regulations, consistent with this act, as shall be necessary and proper to carry its provisions into effect; and that the registers and the receivers of the several land-offices shall each be entitled to receive two dollars at the time of entry, and the same sum when the claim is finally established and the final certificate issued.
 SEC. 7. That the fifth section of the act entitled "An act in addition to an act to punish crimes against the United States, and for other purposes," approved March third, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, shall extend to all oaths, affirmations, and affidavits required or authorized by this act.
 SEC. 8. That parties who have already made entries under the act approved March third, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, of which this is amendatory, shall be permitted to complete the same upon full compliance with the provisions set.

[GENERAL NATURE—No. 17.]
 AN ACT to amend the act entitled "An act to prevent the extermination of fur-bearing animals in Alaska," approved July first, eighteen hundred and seventy.
 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the act entitled "An act to prevent the extermination of fur-bearing animals in Alaska," approved July first eighteen hundred and seventy, is hereby amended so as to authorize the Secretary of the Treasury, and is hereby authorized, to designate the months in which fur-seals may be taken for their skins on the islands of Saint Paul and Saint George, in Alaska, and in the waters adjacent thereto, and the number on or about each island respectively.
 Approved, March 24, 1874.

[GENERAL NATURE—No. 18.]
 AN ACT to establish bonded warehouses for the storing and cleansing of rice intended for exportation.
 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That from and after the passage of this act importers' bonded warehouses, to be used for the storage and cleansing of imported rice intended for exportation to foreign countries, may be established at any port of entry in the United States, under such rules and regulations as the Secretary of the Treasury may prescribe.
 Approved, March 24, 1874.

[RESOLUTION OF GENERAL NATURE—No. 2.]
 JOINT RESOLUTION explanatory of resolution approved January 31, 1869, entitled "A resolution limiting contracts for stationery and other supplies in the executive departments to one year."
 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the resolution approved January thirty-first, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, entitled "A resolution limiting contracts for stationery and other supplies in the Executive Departments to one year," shall not be held, or construed, to apply to, or include, mail-bags, mail-boxes and keys, postal cards, postage stamps, newspaper wrappers, or stamped envelopes.
 Approved, March 24, 1874.

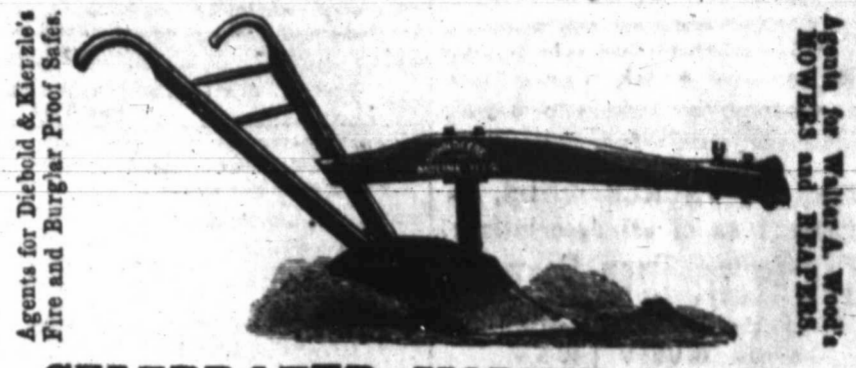
