An Important Decision.

The Sapreme Court of the United States, in the case of Jas. H. Ross v. the city of Watertown, on appeal from the Circuit Court of the United States for the Western District of Wisconsin, have decided several points of great interest to the people of Macoupin County bearing upon the collection of our Court house debt. The case conclusively settles three points-

1. That mandamus is the only remedy by which to enforce the callection of the debt against this county.

2. That there is no remedy with in chancery by which to enforce payment, al though it is fully demonstrated that the remedy by mandamus is, and has been unavailing, and even if either by resignation or failure to elect them, there are in the county no officers capable in law of exe. a single sitting. outing the command of the writ.

A. That no marshal, commissioner or any other officer, can be by the United States Courts appointed to levy and collect taxes upon the taxable property of this county to pay the Court-house bonds -that the only mede of collecting taxes is by means of the laws of this State and by the officers elected by the people of the county, and that no power exists in the

Federal judiciary to levy or collect taxes. In the contest now going on between the people of this county and the bolders of Court-house bonds, this decision is of unusual interest. Our people have been justly alarmed by intimations frequently thrown out that, in case our people should refuse to pay these bonds or levy a tax to pay the interest on them, a United States Marshal would be sent into our county, backed by a company of United States soldiers, armed with muskets and shining bayonet, who would levy a tax upon our property and enforce its collection. It will be a relief to the good people of Macoupin County to know that the highest tribunal in our notion have definitely settled the question that the federal courts caunet exercise this power.
