In no case and for no motive shall the high contracting parties be obliged to deliver up their own subjects. If, in conformity with the laws in force in the state to which the accused belongs, he ought to be submitted to criminal procedure for crimes committed in the other state, the latter must communicate the information and documents, send the implements or tools which were employed to perpetrate the crime, and procure every other explanation or evidence necessary to prosecute

But in 1825 an Englishman named Dickson, armed with a concession from the Spanish Government made an unsuccessf attempt to rob Vigo's harbor of the treasure it had guarded so long. In 1859 another Englishman succeeded in finding two of the galleons, but not having the capital to raise them abandoned the undertaking. Ten years later Colonel Gowen, an American, who bad distinguished himself by raising the Russian fleet of seventy vessels, with all their armament and outfit, which had been sunk in the harbor of Sebastopol during the Orimean war, was applied to by the Spanish Concessionaire, and he having satisfied bimself of the feasibility of the project formed a company in England to carry it out. The Spanish authorities took advantage of some technicality to transfer the concession to a French compony, which, however, was prevented from pursuing the project very far by the breaking out of the Franco Prossian war. It succeeded, however, in recovering several bars of gold and silves, which on being tested, fully sustained the estimate made of the value of the treasure, and Colonel Gowen succeeded in purchasing the goodwill of the French company, which he has transferred to an American association, which intends immediately to enter upon the finding of the long lost treasure.
