It is rather surprising that some Yankee with a genius for calcula-tion has not gone into an estimate of how mach food is consumed by the ordinary American individual in a day, and, basing his figures upon the result, discovered the amount of animal and vegetable food he gets rid of in a week, a month, a year, or an average lifetime.

M. Soyer, the culinary authority, Club, and a great artist to the line, goes into this sort of calculation in one of his books — the Modern Housewife — and obtains results startling, if not alarming, to persons who had never looked at the subject from an arithmetical point of view. To take a boy of ten years to the top of the hill, as he takes his mythical personage, and sur round him with the objects that in the course of his life-time he will have to devour, may be truly de-scribed as appalling.

First there are 30 oxen, then 200 slicep, 100 calves, 200 lambs, 50 pigs, 1,200 fewls, 300 turkeys, 263 pigeons, 140 pounds of salmon, 120 pounds of other fish, 30,000 oysters, 5,443 pounds weight of vegetables, 2434 pounds butter, 24,000 eggs, 41 tons of brend, about 3,000 gallons of tea and coffee, besides tons of truit, barrels of sweetmerts, and hogsheads of wine.

This is, after all, only an outline, and Soyer assures his readers that, so far from exageration, he has, from experience and observation, made up a scale of food for the day, and for a period of sixty years it amounted to 332 tons weight of meat, farinaceous tood, and vegetables. This statement can beither be denied nor affirmed without going luto the statistics, but it is partly corroborated by a gentlman who states that for fifty years he has eaten two eggs for breakfast, make en ing 730 per annum, or a total for half a century of 36,500 eggs. This goes, for a period of only fifty years, only 12,000 better than Soyer, and does not provide for the quantity eaten in puddings, cakes, desserts, and the like. Where does it all come from T

THERE was one incident in the life of Kanlbach which the various biographies published in the daily papers do not allade to, though it conveys a moral which perhaps should not be lost to other artists. Soon after be became known, Kaulbach made for a wobleman, a friend of his, a sketch of a grossly indecent character. It showed all the marks of his genius, but was not a fit picture for an artist to make or for any person to have in his possession. In the course of time, the nobleman who owned the sketch died, and his collection of books and pictures were sold at public auction. Among the latter was this sketch of Kanlbach's, which shared the fate of the rest, and for which probably there was a very lively competition. As 50 Mep's photography had by that time attained a considerable degree of perfection, the sketch was seized upon and thousands of copies made before Kaulbach was aware of the mischief that was being done. He would have given all the ready money he had in the world to suppress the unlucky picture, but it was too late. The copies flew far and wide, and found their way into all the low bar-rooms in the world. Kaulbach is probably better known to the great masses of the common people by this picture than by all the rest of his really great works put together. The lesson this remarkable incident convers is that people should not meddle with filth, and that the vices of men are more apt to rise against them than all the good they have ever performed in their lives.
