A correspondent, writing from Eldo, Nevada, says that there are hot springs there in which numbers of fish can be seen swimming about, though the water is so hot that eggs are cooked in "less than three seconds," The explanation of this phenomenon lies in the fact that those hot springs rise in the banks of streams, the water of which is intensely cold. The cold water, on account of its greater specific gravity, runs on the bottom without mixing much with the water above, and the fish keep in a cool stratum. The water above the springs shows a mean temperature of forty two degrees, and by means of a ther-mometer fastened to the end of a was a Spanish proverb to the effect that if pole and kept as close to the bottom as possible, the temperature of the bottom water from above the springs to a point below them was found to be very low. This stream is one of the many that form the head waters of the Columbia River, and to this point, 1,800 miles from its mouth, the salt water salmon come in hundreds in the spring and fall to spawn.
