Vacating Assessments.

The Court of Errors, sitting at Trenton, N. J., has given a decision reversing a late decision of the Supreme Court in the matter of the assessment for wood pavement in Bread street, Newark. The own ers of the adjoining property. who were assessed for two-thirds of the cost of the improvement, refused to pay, and carried the matter to the Supreme Court, which confirmed the assessment. The case was then earried to the Court of Errors, which decides that it is not within the constitu tional power of the Legislature to compel the owners of adjoining property to pay snything for an improvement in excess of the benefit their property derives from it, and all costs in excess of the benefit must be borne by the public at large. This decision renders certain sections of the city charter, which requires the cost of street improvements, sewers, etc., to be paid by owners of adjoining property unconstitu-
