The word "shyster" has, it appears, been a very difficult one to define. Its meaning is at present a court of law, and lawyers are wrangling over it in the settlement of a case founded upon its use. It has lutely correct. Dictionaries do not contain it, and the time and circumstauces of its coinage have been matters of extreme doubt. It has been considered in its application to contain opproblem and insult, and to be a very hard word, indeed, to use in connection with any body,

Learning that the Hon. John Wentworth first made use of this word at the time when he was Ma yor, and proprietor of the Chicago Democrat, a reporter of the Times. on last evening, repaired to the gentleman's quarters at the Sherman House, and was put into posthe parentage of this disputed title. The explanation of the circumstances which gave rise to it shows conclusively that it never has rightfully borne the opprobrious interpreby some, but is used more in the way of playful ridicule. The following account is in Mr. Wentworth's own language: "Shyster is derived from the English adjective shy. When I was Mayor, the lock up and Poilce Court were under the Court House. When we would make any arrests of gamblers, barlots, &c., there were a class of lawyers about the Court House that would look over the books and see whose names were registered. They would, unbeknown to the policemen, get inside and see if there was anybody they knew who had been arrested. Then they would climb up and peep through the grates. They would carry messages to their friends to come and get them out on special bail. N ben we made large arrests we could hardly tell them from the criminals. Sometimes when we had a large number of arrests, they would steal into the lockup before the prisoners were sent in, so as to

be better able to get a client. "They were always very shy of the police. If a peliceman came anywhere near them on such occasions, they would run. They were always sitting around, and in the the way, watching, carrying messages, and trying to find out when raids were going to be made, and then go and tell of it before the police could get there. One day I saw one of these fellows talking to some gamblers, who were arrested, through the grates. I pulled him away, and he sued me for assault and battery before Justice Hickey. Hickey gave judgment by default for \$25. Never heard what became of the judgment. From the police calling these men the shyest in the world, came the word shysters, given by the German policemen, who did not know the meaning of it. I was down in the church one evening, and one of them came up to my pew, and said there was a very nice gentleman who had been arrested with some gamblers, and wanted to leave with his family who were at the depot waiting for him, and couldn'd find him. He wanted me to write an order in the pew for the man's liberation, or else go out myself and liberate him. I told he had better sit down with me and get religiou. He wouldn't stay. After I got home, I sent for the policeman in charge of the lock up, and asked him what, the matter was. He said, just nothing at all, except a friend of those 'shysterous' kind of fellows had got into the lock up. This was the first time I ever beard the word used.

"After that the word shysterous was frequently used by the policemen. Then came the word shyster to designate the whole class of lawyers who are out of a job, and do

not care where they get it.
"It was never used in a criminal sense. It has got now to apply to to all that class of lawyers who take cases upn the condition that they shall have no pay if they lose, and shall share largely in the profits if they win. It would apply to all that class of attorneys who hunt up flaws in land titles, right of dower, &c. This is the true definition of the word, as used from its origin down to the present day. It applies to a

Origin of the Word "Shyster." fellow, but won't write 'shyster' on his sign. It more pasticularly applies to a lawyer who would rather go into the Police Court for practice than to starve, or do anything dishonorable.

"The Chicago Democrat, when I




