On reaching White Colonel Rose asked him what he meant by breaking the truce, and ordered him to men to fire, which they did, gener \$5,000,000. ally into the air, but several persons were wounded. As already report ed Colonel Rose's orderly attempted to draw his pistol, but his horse became unmanageable and ran away with him before he could draw it from the holster. As soon as firing commenced Colonet Rose rode back to the engine house, where Company C, Sixteenth Infantry, was stationed, and ordered the men to run out a hook and ladder truck and form a barricade, which was speedily done, and the men placed behind it. During the excitement run, and the cry was raised, "Th regulars are going to shoot," and in less than ten minutes the street was deserted.

Lientenant Cushman states positively that, with the exception above stated, not a single shot was fired by the United States troops or cades.

He states that many ludicrous scenes occurred during the météc. Among others the Methodist preacher was standing in front of the Authony House when the firing began, and jumping through a show window, he cut his head and bellowed, "I'm shot! I'm shot!" and it was with difficulty that he was convinced that such was not the fact.

Lieutenant Cushman says that Baxter has nearly 3,000 men under arms, of whom some 800 or 900 are from Pope, Johnson and Saline counties. A number of these were either in the Confederate or federal army during the late war, and are armed with superior weapons. They can be relied on in a fight, and the feeling towards the Brooks faction among this class is very bitter and daily growing worse. As a general thing, Baxters forces are poorly officered. On the other side, Brooks has some 600 men behind the barri cades at the State House, of whom two-thirds are negroes. They are well commanded, and have two ancient 6-pounders in position. Baxter's men are engaged in resurrecting a 20-pounder siege piece, left there during the late war.

The City Printing.

Since the Herald finds it inappropriate to say anything about the city printing, we will say just as much, as we think appropriate, believing that what is known to a hundred individuals ought not to be a secret to the balance. We have no intention to influence the city council, and if we had, we know very well we could not. We rely just as much upon the honesty of chosen representatives as the Herald. A plain statement of facts will therefore do no harm.

Proposals for doing the city printing were invited about middle of March, to be opened on the 28th of March if we recollect rightly. We send in our bid and so did the Herald. Both bids were opened and referred to the committee on printing and were then open to in-

Herald and the Herald undoubtedkeen about three weeks in the hands of the Committee, new proposals were invited under the plea that the committee did not understand the character of the bids. An examination of the bids by a practical printer would have settled the matter at once, or if this was not considered practicable, such new proposals should have been invited, as were not contained in the first bid. We offered bids for advertising, blank warrants, subpoenas, affidavits, handbills, posters, city warrants, letter heads and note heads in our first proposals, and so did the Herald. We underbid the Herald in almost every particular. The new invitation for proposals asks prices for exactly the same printing and adds envelopes and blank rolls of several kinds. Our second bid repeats the same prices we offered the first time as were called for in the second invitation. If the Herald has pursued the same policy, it is all right. If not, we shall lay the matter before the public and ask judgment from their hands. That is all we have to say at present.


