Louisiana.

It is almost impossible to estimate the misery and poverty occa sioned by the overflow of the Mississippi, in the State of Louisiana. Sections of country larger than European principalities are under water, involving the destruction of the crops and stock, besides the immense damage done to the dwellings of the inhabitants. Another distressing feature of this calamity is the malarious diseases that are almost sure to follow on the heels of the innundation.

We trust the appeals of these sorely-stricken people will not be beard in rain, and that the Ameri ean people will again distinguish themselves for that unbounded generosity, that has no equal in the bistory of other natious.

Jails in Texas.

There is one feature of the administration of justice in our state that calls loudly for reform: we mean, in the treatment to which the real or supposed offenders against the law are subjected previous to their removal to the Penitentiary, or acquittal of the charges against them. The average Texas iail is a small insecure dungeon, without ventilation, destitute of fire in winter, and a black hole of Calcutta inSummer, where the wretched inmates covered with vermin, and heavily chained, suffer more tortures than is inflicted on the inmates of Danta's Purgatory.

Persons who have traveled through the State and taken the trouble to inspect these places of "durance vile" will bear us out in the foregoing, seemingly overdrawn description. Thay differ in no re markable degree from the dungeons that are uneathed among the ruins of Herculaneum and Pompei. Those in the larger cities are in a some what better condition, but are by no means in a condition to reflect credit on a civilized and intelligent people like that of Texas. Readers sons and daughters were burned to who may think that crimnals deserve no better treatment at the hands of the law should remember that into such places the innocent, as well as the guilty, are consigned, and, owing to the delays of the law, years sometimes clapse before a fair trial has dispelled the cloud that malevolence may have cast upon the character of some inno cent, but unfortunately poor man. .

We have inspected our County Jail and find it as free from the objectious urged against the system ternoon. J. B. Harris entered Basil Duke, as is possible under the circumstances. By the appointment of vigilant watchmen, and other measures of security, the necessity of chaining the inmates has been obviated to a considerable extent; while the premesis and surround ings are clean, tidy, and free from the offensiveness that the want of space might naturally be supposed to occasion.

KRNKA, the inventor of the breech-loader which has been adopt ed by the War Department at St. Petersburg for the Russian army, has just published a pamphlet at Prague, in which he describes a new invention of his called the "Kulomet," or hand mitrailleur. The Kulomet, he says, is of simple construction, and may be used by a soldier on any ground, however hilly, just like a rifle. It is comparatively cheaper and simpler than the Wernel and other breech loaders used by European armies, and a soldier armed with it can, under all circumstances, fire thrice as rapidly as with the zundpadelgewehr; in battle it will fire twenty four shots a minute, while other breechloaders only fire from twelve to thirteen a minute. Any rifle may be converted into a Culomet, and any cartridge may be used with it.




