A recent paper in the Revue des Deux Mondes, by M. Maxime du Camp, brings out some startling facts relative to births, marriages, and deaths in Paeis. The last census of the city was made in 1872, and the whole population at that time was 6,851,792, of which num-ber scarcely one third were to the manor born. The Parisians proper counted 642,718, while 1,031,865 yers from the provinces, and 177, 209 strangers to the republic. The figures given in regard to the diminution of births are very striking. In 1868 it was shown before the Academy of Medicine that in five years the population of France bad this small proportion was still fur-16 in 10,000. In Paris, from 1863 rights." to 1869, the birth rate was 59,293, about 324 to every 10,000 people, while in 1871 only 37,410 births were registered. As to marriages, M. Du Camp says: "The union of two people, young, healthy, and in telligent, is one of the rarest things to be met with in Paris," and he tim. urges this as reason why birchs are in such small proportion to marriages, and young life is so brutally destroyed. With regard to the death rate in Paris, M. Du Camp

"From 1865 to 1869 the deaths were 46,831 annually. In 1872 there were 45,782 deaths, but between 1869 and 1872 what exact number of people in Paris died there never will be known, save that it oc curred in vast proportions. It seems certain that the oblivary record during these years was greater than during the cholera season of 1832. In August, 1870, the deaths for the mouth in Paris were 4,942 about the normal figure; but in Septem ber it increased to 5,322; in October it was 7,543, and in November had swollen to 12,885. In the year 1876 Paris lost by death the fearful number of 73,563. The capital was suffering then from cold and hunger, but in the beginning of 1871 matters were even worse. Think think of it. In January the record says 19,233 people died in Paris; then the city fell, and in February there was a decrease of 3,000 deaths Eighteen hundred and seventy one was, however, a sad year for human life, as, from war and pestilence, the deaths amounted to 86,760. It is appalling to sum the mortuary counts of those two dreadful years -1870 and 1871-which foot up

160,323. The deaths caused by Prussian shot and shell, "the blood and iron regime," were insignificant, scarcely worth counting, only some 6,083 in all. When we divide this fearful holocust into its proportion of men and women, we find that of the 160,000 who perished in Paris, 70,387 were women."

Thus does Paris pay the penalty of its gayety, its folly, and its vice. It bodes ill for a republic which shows such a record of infanticide, of badly assorted marriages, and fearful death rates. It is not difficult to forsee where a republic with s constantly diminishing population






