Charles Sumner Among Women

[Letter from Mrs. M. C. Ames to the New York Independent.]

Charles Sumner lived and died a moral hero to women. Such men aloue appeal to the element of worship which lives ever in the unperverted woman. Few approached sufficiently near to discover any human blemish which might mar the grand proportions of their god. To their eyes he tabilled in person the ideal of greatness, intellectual moral. He was cast in the mold of the Vatican Apollo. "The shape and gesture proudly eminent" were his. nor, for justice; his devotion to human freedom, sealed with his blood, commanded their moral faculties. His Greek love for beauty in its purest forms, his exquisite tastes, his wonderful culture, which had gleaned in every field of human knowledge, sufficed the sestbetic nature of the higher order of women; while the marvelous sweetness of his smile, the gentleness of his courtesy, his reverence for the finest womanbood made him ever in their eyes, from first to last, "the blameless knight" of the ideal man. Let no woman fear to own a capacity for such worship, lest it shall be mistaken and misjudged by the vulgar for weakling sentiment. Your god may not be a god a all; nevertheless, hold fast to your ideal of him-by so much will you bring him nearer to it. If it were possible for woman to cease to worship the sovereign in man or for man to cease to revere the spiritual in which false prophets now delight to prophesy. Through all his public life Mr. Sumser was the recipient of far off adoring letters (in no sense to be confounded with love letters) addressed to him by the country-women. These letters, received from strangers whom he never met, would have made many volumes, He numbered among his personal friends and private correspondents ladies of the highest rank and culture abroad and of the highst gifts and most extended influence at home. Several of the Paris journals express great sympathy with the misfortunes of a Frenchman who, being in Dublin at the time of an execution for murder some three years of a piece of the rope used upon the "mourntul occasion." He is said to have had an interview with "the celebrated Calcraft," and for the sum of five sovereigns to have purchased the whole rope, which he brought back to Paris in triumph, believing himself to be henceforward protected from the shafts of misfortune. Within a month one of his children was nearly hanged with this rope by her brother, who was playing at "hangman," and, though the father "cut-her down" she has never fully recovered from the shock. Some time afterward the owner of the rope went to Havre on business connected with his trade, and as he had a large sum of money in his possosion when he was returning to Paris, he placed it in a bob, which he made secure with the "lucky rope" The box was stolen during tue journey, and though it was recovered at the Paris terminus with the rope attached to it, the money had been abstracted. It might have been thought that after two such disappointments the rope would have been got rid of as a talisman of evil, but that such was not the case is evident from the fact of its owner, who had experienced heavy losses in his business since the robbery, having attempted to commit suicide with it so recently at last week. Just as he had "cut down" his dauguter, so his wife "cut down" him, and according to last accounts he is almost convalescent. When he is completely restored to health he will probably see the propriety of parting with such an unlucky purchase, and, as there is no lack of collectors in Paris, he may, by a skillful recital of the dramatic events attached to this rove.

The Duchess of Edinburg seems to bave fallen into her new life very quickly and comfortably. She is said to have been very much impressed with Windsor Castle, and to have described it as a royal residence. At present she and her husband are quartered at Buckingham Palace, as their own residence, Cladecorated, and will not be ready for them until the autumn. Even when all has been done to it, the Clarence House is a poor place, but it has the advantage of being next door to St. James' Palace, with which it has direct communication. In the event, therefore, of the Duchess giving any receptions the State apartments of the palace will be placed at her dis posal; though, hitherto, the Duke has not shown himself of a very hospitable or generous nature. Mean-while, the Duchess drives daily in the park with him amid the salutes of the public. A series of grand entertainments are being organized, the first of which came off last night at the Albert Hall, where Mr. Arthur Sullivan's oratorio, "The Light of the World, "was performed in the presence of the Royalites and an audience 9,000 strong.
