**The Strangest of Picture Gal-  
eries.**  
There is one gallery of pictures in  
Brussels so unique in character that  
they will stay in the memory when  
better things have faded out. This  
is the **Wierz Museum.** The great  
picture is the struggle for the body  
of **Patroclus.** It don't matter who  
Patroclus was, except that he looks  
very dead indeed; but the point of  
the picture is the awful strain of  
two sets of men, both bound to con-  
quer or die in the attempt. It is  
like looking on at a duel when you  
sympathize with both sides. There  
is passion enough in it for the whole  
battle of Waterloo. This is almost  
the only picture into which the artist  
has not infused as much oddity and  
bitterness as genius. The impres-  
sion of earthy authority is  
grandy shown in a giant grating  
a woman's shoulder between his  
teeth, and treading helpless mor-  
tals under foot. Perhaps the most  
curious idea is expressed in the  
"Man of the Future," an enlarged  
and noble figure of a man, holding  
in his big hand, and regarding with  
pitying smile the baubles that have  
been most valued by mankind—  
coins, flags, orders, gems and fire-  
arms. Two angels look on with  
bin-in sympathetic wonder. Near  
this is a figure of Napoleon in the  
flames of hell, while his victims  
hold out broken limbs to him as the  
fropbies of his career. A bitter hat-  
red of Napoleon and French despotism  
runs through the whole gallery;  
and yet the artist, against his will,  
has given to Napoleon a face so sad  
and noble that the sympathy of the  
beholder cleaves to him, and not to  
those who suffered by him. Every  
contrivance is resorted to to keep  
up the illusion of reality. One looks  
through a knot-hole in a board  
fence into a charnel house, where  
a woman, too soon buried in cholera  
time, is just forcing up her coffin  
lid, and realizing the horror of the  
situation. Through another hole is  
seen a mother, driven mad by starva-  
tion in Napoleon's campaigns, who  
is cutting up her child, to boil it in  
a kettle. The curve of the little  
cheek, half covered in her apron, is  
the only softening touch in the ter-  
rible picture. But not all these fan-  
tasies are horrible. In a corner a  
painted girl smiles at you, through  
a crack in a painted door, so natu-  
rally that you smile back at her be-  
fore you can realize that she is only  
a picture. In another, more lovely  
than words can tell, a mother, just  
arrived in heaven, recognizes the  
child that had gone before. Wierz  
was a wonderful flesh painter. Some  
of his nude figures of women remind  
one of Lady Mary Montague's con-  
clusion when she saw Turkish wom-  
en in a bath, "I was here con-  
vinced of the truth of a reflection that  
I have often made, that if it were  
fashion to go naked, the face would  
be hardly observed, and many not-  
ed beauties would have to abdicate  
their thrones." Wierz was low-  
born and poor, and the iron early  
entered his soul to reappear in his  
pictures, which are full of scorn and  
bitterness toward all the world that  
called itself superior to him. He is  
as vulgarly self-conscious in his art  
as Byron was in his poetry. He was  
of that order of genius which,  
in literature, has produced Frank-  
enstein and Yehok. Poe's stories,  
and some of Hawthorn's novels—a  
select few out of all humanity who  
are under a sort of opium influence  
from their birth. They love the  
world no better than the world  
loves them.—(Mrs. Ella Thompson's  
Travels in Europe.)

**CORPUS CHRISTI, May, 16.**  
Five of the fifteen Mexicans en-  
gaged in the Penesal murder, tele-  
graphed last Tuesday, have been  
arrested, and a force of twenty men  
are after the others. The bodies of  
the four murdered men were fear-  
fully mangled and cut to pieces.  
To-day, the great ship channel  
from Corpus Christi Bay to Aran-  
zas Pass, nearly seven miles long,  
and which has been under construc-  
tion for seven years, was exam-  
ined and accepted by Special State  
Engineer W. H. Russell, of Brown-  
sville. Its total cost will amount to  
nearly a million dollars. Its aver-  
age depth is about ten, and width  
one hundred and seventy five feet.  
The people are jubilant and happy,  
and expect steamships to enter their  
bay within a month.  
Great quantities of wool are com-  
ing in from the interior, and every-  
thing is prosperous.

**WASHINGTON, May 15.**  
The California and Texas Con-  
struction Company has made pub-  
lic plans for building the Texas  
and Pacific Railroad. The follow-  
ing are the details:  
In order that the property of the  
Texas and Pacific Railroad Com-  
pany may be valuable to Texas rail-  
road construction share-holders, or  
contractors for building the line, it  
is essential that the road from Tex-  
arkana to Brookston, thirty-six  
miles, and from Dallas to Fort  
Worth, thirty-one miles, be com-  
pleted and equipped. The cost will  
be \$2,250,000. Still due to construc-  
tion company about \$1,500,000 sub-  
scriptions. In order to make it the  
interest of these subscribers to pay  
up, a committee of three stockhold-  
ers of the company is to be appoint-  
ed to receive these subscriptions  
and apply them; first, to building  
the line from Dallas to Fort Worth;  
second to the equipment of the line  
as now operated; third, to the ex-  
tension of the work from Brookston  
to Texarkana. This time, when com-  
pleted, is to entitle the construction  
company to \$4,445,000 of construc-  
tion bonds, 1,905,000 acres of land  
grant bonds, and \$3,175,000 of  
stock.
