Galvestonians who can remember  
the first years of the Methodist  
Church in this city will remember  
the person named above, who was  
both an able and an exemplary min-  
ister of the gospel in this city a  
third of a century ago. The "Coun-  
ter Journal" mentions him among  
the distinguished ministers in at-  
tendance at the great conference in  
that city, and says truly that he is  
now a man of national reputation.  
He was born and educated in Eng-  
land. After arriving at the age of  
maturity, he came to America, and  
became the pastor of a church in  
Baltimore, and subsequently preach-  
ed in Washington, D. C. Thence  
he removed to Texas, where he re-  
mained a year or two, and moved  
to South Carolina; thence to Ala-  
bama, and lastly to Tennessee. He  
went to Nashville in 1856, and be-  
came the general book editor for  
the Southern Methodist Church,  
and for several years past has been  
the editor of the "Christian Advo-  
cate." He is now sixty-two years  
of age. For the last twenty years  
he has been engaged in writing a  
very elaborate commentary on the  
gospels, which work was recently  
completed. He is also the author  
of several smaller commentaries  
and numerous religious works. He  
is a most intelligent preacher, a bril-  
liant writer, and one of the most  
active men in the church.—Galves-  
ton News.

other counties. A great proof wheat  
is cultivated in Tyler and other  
counties. A variety known as Cali-  
fornia wheat has done well in some  
localities for several years. In the  
northern part of the State, on the  
1st of April, wheat was six to ten  
inches high; in more southern local-  
ities two feet in height, and head-  
ing out. In many cases it made an  
excellent winter pasture, and is  
claimed to give better promise of a  
crop in consequence.

**Fighting in Arkansas.**  
Dispatches from Arkansas bring  
news of great disorder and consid-  
erable bloodshed. On the 18th Geo.  
Lacy killed Robt. Raymond in a  
street fight—both colored. Several  
other street fights have occurred.  
A shooting scrape took place at  
Duvall's Bluff between a Baxter  
man and a Brooks man: the Baxter  
ite was wounded.  
At Pine Bluff two or three affrays  
occurred, the first caused by the  
seizure by Baxter men of State arms  
carried there by Brooks discharged  
negroes, who arrived there by boat.  
The arms were restored, however,  
and, in retaliation, Murphy, who  
was captured by King White and  
subsequently released upon a pro-  
mise that he would leave the State,  
again organized a mob and burned  
a ginhouse near town and threat-  
ened to burn several dwellings in the  
city.  
A dispatch to King White says:  
"For God's sake, stop him (Murphy),  
or have him stopped, or he  
will burn us up."  
A portion of King White's caval-  
ry goes down in the morning to put  
a stop to depredations, and it is  
the opinion that Murphy will have  
or ganized a force armed with guns  
taken from the State House, and will  
resist arrest, and another fight will  
be the result.  
In fact the warfare, on a small  
scale, will be carried into all parts  
of the State; one hardly will occur  
that a killing will not follow.  
One Baxter man to-night, show-  
ing a handful of Henry rifle cart-  
ridges, said he would kill a negro  
with each before he was satisfied.  
Gov. Baxter's proclamation to-  
day is occasioning some comment in  
Brooks circles, and the belief is that  
Baxter intends to bring Brooks and  
all his principals before a civil  
tribunal, at an early day, and try  
them for treason.  
This, with the hasty action of the  
Legislature in declaring a number  
of seats of the Brooks men vacant  
and electing others, and of inquiry  
into the affairs of State officers, is  
regarded by the Brooks faction as  
a threat to compel them to leave  
the State and turn the entire gov-  
ernment over to Baxter.  
A dispatch at midnight of the  
18th says that a dozen men who  
went over the river to fight, have  
killed a desperate, there named  
Massey. It is also stated that sev-  
eral persons were wounded at Pine  
Bluff to-day, and to-night General  
Newton, of the Baxter forces, held  
a consultation with Gen. Pagan,  
and it was arranged that the State  
Guard should take formal posses-  
sion of the State House to-morrow  
morning.
