Letter from Fort Davis.

FORT DAVIS, May 25.

Editor San Antonio Express:

Six or eight days ago four men
 en route for New Mexico arrived at
 this place and took too much mes-
 cal. During their happy moments
 one of the party got to "walking on
 his left ear," and wished to put a
 head onto somebody, for which he
 was put in the prisoner's hotel *a la*
militaire, by request of the ex deputy
 sheriff, where he was detained until
 fatuo, when he was allowed to make
 tracks. Sometime during the night
 two of the aforesaid tangle-legged

"critters" put in an appearance of
 pugilistic intentions at the store of
 the ex deputy sheriff, Bro. & Co. and
 succeeded in clearing out the "she-
 bang" none remaining except a Mex-
 ican, all the firm having left, one
 succeeding in getting as far as the
 roof of the house. The ex deputy
 sheriff writes a note to the Captain
 commanding the Post, requesting
 the assistance of U. S. troops, to ar-

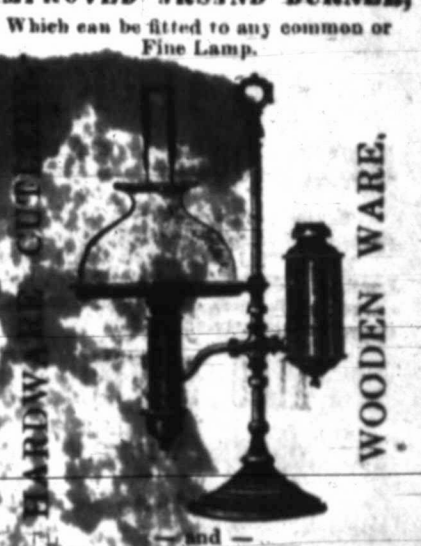

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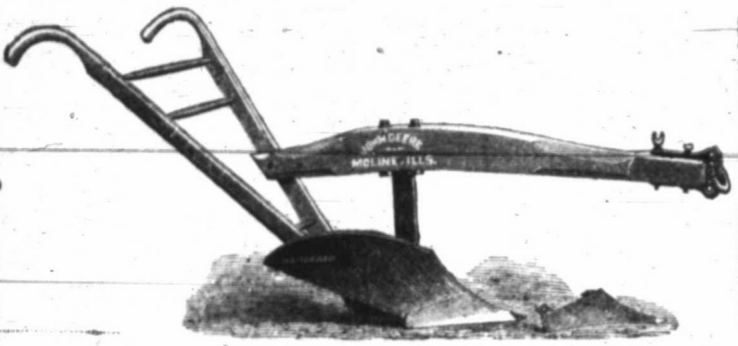
