News from Western Texas.

The Pleasanton Stock Journal of May 26th, after speaking of the improvement of that place, gives us the following items:

Cotton is in bloom, and wagon loads of roasting ears are off for market.

The Irishman Keef, who robbed Mr Harkness' store of \$300 has been arrested and lodged in jail at Frio City. He converted a case knife and a pocket knife into saws by means of a small file, with the design of cutting the iron bars and making his escape. He was frustrated by a fellow prisoner who betrayed him to the keeper. Keef is an old "cracksmen," for he was well supplied with house-breaking implements.

On the line of Medina and Frio counties, there was kept a short time ago a liquor establishment—the place where Langley was killed, and in which a good deal of drinking and rowdying were carried on. This "doggerly" has been broken up and the house converted into a church, and a Sabbath school started therein.

Mr. Felix Knox being expelled from Dogtown that he was a Mexican bandit, is now in the Nueces with the same followers. Some excitement was occasioned in Dogtown by the rumor that Garza and his men were approaching. The people of the place, however, in anticipation of the Garza's arrival, were armed and ready to charge with the same result as was made his escape. He was a bold, relentless fighter, and while in prison here, swore vengeance against the place.

On Saturday, a Mexican approached the house of Mr. M. C. Yates, frightening his little children, by demanding money, and threatening them with death if they refused to disclose the place of its concealment. He proceeded to dismount but upon being informed that there were men in the house, he rode off and was joined by several other Mexicans. They returned and surrounded the house, but after consultation departed without further hostile demonstrations. News of the occurrence was circulated too late to insure successful pursuit. It is probable they are a portion of Alberto's command. It becomes our citizens for awhile to be on the qui vive.

Advices from Nueces county are to the effect that three teamsters were robbed on the Wesatch, about fifteen miles from Lagartoville, by a party of Mexicans. The robbers approached the camp shortly after dark, and with pistols presented, took the trio, bound them, and proceeded to despoil them of their money, which amounted to about seventeen dollars. Before leaving, the robbers untied the prisoners and gave them orders not to leave the camp that night under penalty of death. Next morning the alarm was given, and a company of men went in pursuit. Three were captured, and being identified by the wagoners they were strung up to a limb and left hanging.

NEW MEXICO.—The proposition to make New Mexico a State is incomplete. Let us have a State out of Alaska and another out of Arizona and two or three out of Texas. The surest way to perfect our system of representative government is to "enfranchise" the icebergs of Alaska and the plains of New Mexico, and give them Senators enough to outvote New York and Pennsylvania. Carlyle sneered at manhood suffrage by demanding doghood suffrage. Let us have coyote suffrage and buffalo representation. Then it will be proper to admit New Mexico as a State. But if it is necessary to have men before we have a State, New Mexico can wait. New York and New England, with their millions of people and hundreds of millions of property interests, are rather tired of being outvoted on such questions as inflation by representatives of pine woods, prairie stretches and Rocky Mountains.—N. Y. Herald.

ANOTHER INDIAN WAR.—A despatch comes to us from the West announcing another Indian war. These despatches about Indian wars, which come just about the time appropriation bills are discussed in Congress, seem calculated to impress the imaginations of Representatives and lead to the granting of

large sums of money. We prefer to receive our Indian news from Gen. Sheridan and should be largely governed by the opinions of that great soldier in our estimates of war.—N. Y. Herald.

MILL RIVER.—They are a thrifty people down East. For two years there was no record of any expenditure made on account of the Williamsburg reservoir save for the salary of a gatekeeper. There was an immense force, sufficient to sweep a city from its path if a city had been in the way, held by the slightest tether, just over the heads of the people. Not a dime for an expert to come now and then to take a look and see that all was right; only a stipend to a gatekeeper of very mild intelligence. Naturally the consequence was—what it was. But if a reservoir had made such havoc in any valley of the West or South what a chorus of superior declamation we should hear on the subject from the down East spouters, men and women together.—N. Y. Her'd.

GEN. MCKENZIE! Where is Gen. McKenzie? That is the question now, and nobody is happy because there is no answer.

The Galveston News urges that the visit of the Kansas City delegation should be returned by a delegation from Galveston. Kansas City is now shipping goods into the interior of Texas.

MR. MELLISH, the deceased member of Congress, was at one time a general news and short-hand reporter on the staff of the New York Tribune.

GEN. WESLEY MERRITT, United States Army, accompanied by his wife, has arrived in Cincinnati, on a brief absence from his post in Texas, and is stopping at the residence of his father-in-law, J. T. Warren, Esq.

MME DE METERNICH has returned to Paris, and the realm of "chiffons" rejoices at the advent of its queen. This is the lady who caused the duel last week between her brother and Count Montebello.

REV. FOUNTAIN E. PITTS, who died near Louisville on Friday evening last, was one of the most prominent members of the Southern Methodist Church, and at the time of his death, a delegate to the general conference.

A WASHINGTON SPECIAL to the New York Tribune is authority for the rumor that in consequence of the ill health of Gen. Butler his physicians have recommended him to visit Europe, and that President Grant will tender him the mission to Vienna, in place of John Jay, now in this country. Another bottling up case.

We have earnestly favored the establishment of the military telegraph line, connecting all the frontier posts with Denison at one end and with Brownsville at the other. THE AUSTIN STATE GAZETTE accuses the Houston Telegraph of "radicalism," because the latter favors free schools. Well, the State Gazette is right, and so is the Telegraph. Free schoolism is essential republicanism, and the antipodes of democracy. A republican administration in this State, weakly supported, powerfully opposed and crippled, and with many draw backs in the way of bad appointments, established an excellent free school system. The democratic administration came in with immense popularity, and the people ready to support everything it did; and lo! our free schools all stopped at once. Since then, a miserable four-month's abortion has been patched up, merely to enable democracy to say it is in favor of free schools. Democracy, especially in the South, has always been opposed to free schools. If not, why did they so long refuse to establish them; why did they oppose them when established by the republicans; why did they break them down as soon as they got into power? We shall never have an effective system of free schools in Texas while the democracy remains in power. When will the masses awake to this fact?

THE HOUSTON TELEGRAPH is striving to come to the front rank of journalism, and its efforts are laudable. But it has grave difficulties to surmount. Houston has never given anything like the support which it has been demanding. The telegraph right and wrong, and this iniquity will cling to its skirts. Then it is trying to induce national republican principles in the Bourbon democracy of Texas—a hopeless task. Last of all, starting out to be an independent journal par excellence, the bait of the State printing was too tempting, and it fell into the very vice, or at least into the equivocal position, it intended to oppose and criticize in others. Nevertheless, the Telegraph is an excellent paper, and reliable and honest in everything except its apologies for Gov. Coke in the printing matter, and in its pretensions to democracy. In both these last, it has the same opinions we have, and is merely throwing tubs to the turbulent whale of the hour.

Congressman for Western Texas.

That able, liberal, and patriotic journal, the Indianola Bulletin, agrees with the EXPRESS as to the importance of choosing the right sort of a man to represent Western Texas in Congress at the election next fall. It agrees with us, also, in the belief that sectionalism and partyism have done the West more harm than anything else in the past. In reference to the future it says:

No man should be brought before the people for their suffrages to import Federal or State offices unless he is a man known to have the true interests of his constituency at heart, be he Democrat, Conservative or Republican. Self-interest will always influence the narrow-minded man, no matter to which party he claims to belong. Western Texas, we trust, will wake up to her true interests in the future, and at the next fall election bring forward such men as candidates for Congress from either party, that have the true interests and welfare of all the people whom they represent at heart.

A WASHINGTON CORRESPONDENT of the Herald of this city, after an interview with President Grant, has this to say of him:

Some people are in the habit of supposing that Gen. Grant is a commonplace man. I had the opinion once myself; I don't believe a word of it now. When he raises his steel blue eyes from under his eyebrows and lids, which overhang a good deal, I think he looks clean through you. I know he looked through me once to my back bone. Instead of running the wise man of Chappaqua, the Democrats untrifled would have done a great sight better to have nominated the General and owned a half interest in him; then he would not have been a party President, which would have been better for all of us.

These baths would complete the enjoyment and the healthfulness of life in such a glorious climate as this. We have the life-giving power, and the beauty and glory of the sunshine during the day; we need also the cooling, cleansing, comforting, and healing of the living waters at night, or in the morning, or whenever convenient. It is true that property owners have these baths already, but the masses who do not own property, the laboring people who are of such value, and whose labor create the necessity for more bathing than is required by any other class, have not such advantages. There are thousands of busy, heated, tired people,—laborers, employees, strangers, people of all sorts—to whom a daily bath would be a benefit and a blessing.

The city is always notably healthful; these baths would make it more so, and would be a great attraction to strangers. It would give the city a sort of classical and poetic fame, in addition to the historic and romantic fame it already enjoys. It would be a great protection against infectious diseases of the loathsome sort, occasioned by want of cleanliness. Such baths, sufficient for the whole city, could be cheaply constructed.

The city of New York has taken measures to afford bathing facilities to the people the present season. Commissioner Van Nort has determined to place the two public free baths in their old position at the foot of Charles street, North River, and Fifth street, East River. The Legislature of the State has appropriated eighty thousand dollars for four additional baths.

The following days have been set apart for men and boys: Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, from five o'clock A. M. until ten P. M., on week days, and on Sunday, from five o'clock A. M. until nine P. M. For women and girls only Monday and Friday will be set apart, between the hours of five A. M. and nine P. M.

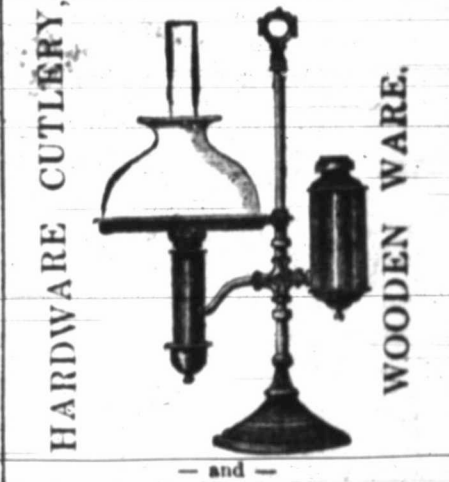
