JUDGE JOHN B. JONES, an old and highly esteemed citizen and lawyer of Galveston, is dead.

The rumor is that Gen. McKenzie pursued the cattle raiders into Mexico, but they entered a large town, and he could not attack them.

The Houston Telegraph says that the Houston Age "has yet to learn that the United States is a Nation." True, but where did the Telegraph learn it? Not in a Democratic school. It is the essential, bottom, all comprehensive principle of Republicanism.

COKE's administration has been ashered in with a violation of the pledge to call a constitutional convention, with a shameful public printing scandal, with the stain of repudiation upon the State credit, with vast frontier-expense and no frontier defense, with much of the State ever-run by bands of thieves and murderers, with lynch law usurping the place of the courts. Have we a State government?

At HOLMES, 110 NONO, the venerable Pontiff of the Roman Catholic Church, is one day reported sick, then recovering, then sick again. The last accounts are unfavorable. From his great age, his death may be looked for daily. This is a matter of special and deep interest to Catholics throughout the world, and of public and historical interest to all Christendom. His reign has been long, eventful, and, with the exception of political and temporal losses, prosperous and popular.

The attempt to form a coalition in the French National Assembly between the centres, or conservative men of the Right and Left, seems beset with difficulties. The Right objects to the recognition of the Republic, and the Left insists on it. The Bonapartists favor a plebiscite, or vote by the people, to determine the character of the future government. This is in accordance with the speech of the Prince Imperial on his last birthday at Chislehurst. It is the old Napoleonic programme. Napoleon Bonaparte and Louis Napoleon won the imperial throne in that way.

MURDER, lynch law, and civil war seem about to over-run Comanche, Bown, Bell, San Saba, and other counties. Chas. M. Webb, deputy sheriff of Comanche county, who had caused the arrest of three of a gang of cattle thieves, was surrounded and murdered in cold blood in Comanchetown, by four of their bands. Having committed other murders, the citizens rose en masse, and one report is that they had killed eleven of the gang, while another report is that five of them were in irons, and that seven more were surrounded by 150 citizens in a fort-were thickly. The people will not be so easily killed all of them who do not escape. Eighteen persons, including the nine killed in Belton jail, are said to have been killed in Bell county. The frontier counties are over-run by organized bands of cattle thieves, says an Austin dispatch, and it is feared the jail at Georgetown will be broken open and the imprisoned thieves rescued. Vigilance committees are forming rapidly, and the thieves and murderers will all be killed or driven off before the war ceases.

THE Houston Telegraph is essaying the shrewd enterprise of establishing a party with the principles of the Republican party; the name of the Democratic party, without the party history, responsibilities, and odium of either party. We wish it full success so far as its sentiments and principles are concerned. But—its first convert is Tracy! However, the Telegraph is an able and excellent paper, is becoming quite popular, will be universally read, and will do great good. Its conductors are not politicians, but journalists, and whatever may be come of their party enterprise, their journal will succeed. That is their aim; let them stick to it. Journalism and politics are two things, and every wise journalist knows it. Being in Texas, they are moderate, national Democrats by profession; in the North, they would be moderate, anti-radical Republicans. The policy is by no means to be despised, and will win.

A Sutherland Springs correspondent of the Herald of this city speaks of the "Carcaista," a romantic channel that begins in the lower edge of Bexar county and runs through the post oaks and black jacks into the San Antonio river. It is apparently the ancient bed of a river. The width is about three hundred yards; the sand of its bed has been drifted into little mounds, around which are to be found wild cherry and dwarf cedar bushes. The wear and tear of years have sloped the banks from much of their course; but at intervals of half or three quarters of a mile, can still be seen bluffs of red sandstone, worn by rain and wind into columns and pierced with caves, the homes of wolves, panthers, &c. Wild cattle, wild horses and wild hogs, panthers, wolves, catamounts and leopard cats abound in this region lying on only nine miles west of a thickly settled county.

Rumored Hanging of Horse Thieves.

AUSTIN, June 2. A gentleman from Belton say the wife murderer Coleman, from Coryell county, was first arrested by citizens, who tied him to a tree, and were about roasting him alive, he was rescued by the sheriff and a posse. This occasioned a doubling of the guards at the Belton jail on the night of the massacre. The citizens, however, were determined to make an example of him and others. What is a little surprising is that long before information could have been given of the shooting in the jail teams flocked into Belton from all parts of the country, and the men in each case were fully armed, even though in some cases their wives and families were with them. There is a rumor that eighteen horse-thieves were hung on the San Saba river, near San Saba town, night before last.

We see the statement in the papers that Dr. Bonds Baker, of Austin, will be the acting chairman of the State Central Committee of the Republican party until the State Convention. This is a very good appointment. It seems like the executive headship of the Texas Republican party is about to take on something like respectability, an accomplishment it has not been able to boast since 1869. But we warn Dr. Baker at the very outset that if he takes as counselors and advisers the "old set" who have poisoned the public stomach for years, who have poisoned Republicanism in its every movement by their personal odiousness, and have made it a close corporation for their own selfish ends, thereby driving thousands of the best men in the State from the Republican fold, he will not have the support of the masses of the party. Indeed, any ring dictum from Austin will meet with open opposition, by tongue and pen, in council and in the field. He will please remember that the EXPRESS is the only Republican daily in the State.

It is not yet certain which party has elected the Governor of Oregon.
