HENRI RECHEFORT, the noted French epublican, communist, and revolutionary editor of the "Lautern" and other papers before and during the Franco-Prussian war, and whom President Thiers had exiled to New Caledonia, having escaped, lia, is now creating quite a sensation both in this country and in Europe. In the last New York Herald appears a letter from him, both in French and in English, the French version seven columns, and English five columns, in length, giving an account of the origin and progress of the war between France and Germany, and especially of the siege of Paris. In this country, we have read only one side of the history of the terribly bloody scenes at tending the surrender of the city, and the crushing out of the communists by the French military forces. We have read prices revolting accounts of the murderous cruelty of the communists; but in Rochefort's letter we are able to read the equally revolting account of the bloody, ruthless slaughter of 35000 men, women and children by the military. Rochefort will cause a tremendous diversion, perhaps a revolution, in the present critical juncture of French politics.

MIXED schools are opposed by both hites and blacks, not only in the South, out all over the Union, with a few exceptions. 


