NATIVE WINE.—The fine grape-growing region of country of which San Antonio is the center, ought, as it seems to us, to produce excellent native wines. The Mustang grape makes a very good wine, when properly made, but its capacity in this respect has never been fully tested. But, in addition, this country produces delightful grapes for eating, and that in great abundance. If properly cultivated, we do not see why all this region might not become as famous for fine grapes and good wine as the notable Los Angeles country of California.

Eastern Texas abounds in the sweet summer grape, which produces a delicious wine. We find the following in the Tyler Index:

Mr. J. G. Waldert has been shipping during this week some of his wines to Cincinnati. This is an argument in favor of Texas as a grape-growing country. Mr. Waldert is a grower of the fruit and manufacturer of the wine. The old gentleman is very particular and his wine is sold before he ships it, for fear it be adulterated before it reaches its destination. There is certainly a great interest in the culture and manner of growing the grape in the way the wine is made and handled. We have known several persons to make considerable quantities of wine but it has failed to have the rich aroma and life and body that characterize Mr. Waldert's manufacture.

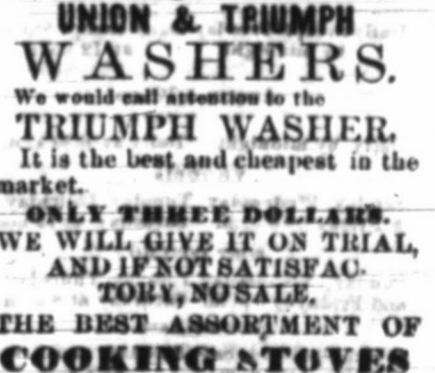

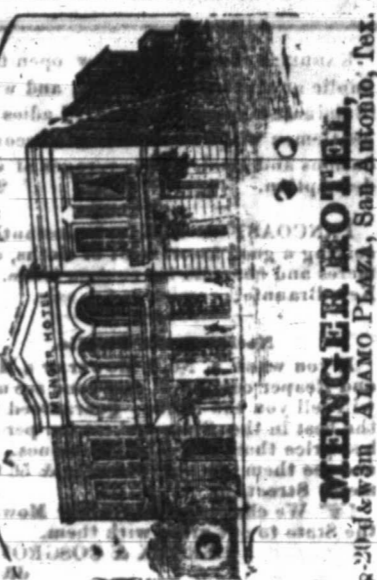
