#### French Revolution Imminent

As we have frequently stated heretofore the serious issue in the French National Assembly at the present time is the Republic or the Empire. The various parties with their various wings and sections have now faller into line under one or the other of these standards. It seems as if either the Empire or the Republic would be declared within a short time, or rather, that in the contest between the two violent and bloody revolution might break out at any time. The imperialists, who wish to place the Prince Imperial, son of Louis Napoleon, on the throne, have the advantage of being in possession of the government. President McMahon is a staunch Bonapartist.

On yesterday, in the French National Assembly, M. Giraud, deputy from Nievre and member of the Left, read a document which he stated had been circulated during the election in that department. The paper arges Bonspartist officials to confer all appointments in their gift on retired officers who are in favor of the election of the Bonspartist candidate, and adds that the Minister of finance, M. Magne, has furnished a list of such officers

to the government. Giraud demands hon

est inquiry into the affair. Rouher disclaimed any knowledge of the document, and insignated that it was fictitious. He declared himself in favor of an inquiry and would discuss the anbject when the results of the investigation were presented to the Assembly. Gambetta accused Ministers Magne and Cesere of complicity in this discreditable business. The Bonapartist members of the Assembly indorsed Rouber's offer to discass the matter, when investigated ; Ronher then reminded the Chamber of the charges in relation to the improper and fraudulent contrac's and appointments reported by the commission, on the acts of the September government against M Gambetta A violent scene followed. Gambetta replied that he had always answered questions of the "commission, but did not admit the right of the wretchee" with which term he branded the Bonapartists, to question him. The tumult and shouting which this reply produced, rendered Rouber's rejoinder inaudible.

Buffett threatened a vote of censure on Gambetta for the words he had spoken after thesitting. Gambetta and his friends were followed as they were leaving the Chamber and insulted by Bonapartists.

It is evident, also, that the young Prince Imperial has the sympathy, and, at least, the moral support of most of the European courts The Empress Eugenie is the most popular woman in Europe, and she and her son are treated with marked cordiality by all the royal families. The Czar recently went to Chiselhurst and visited the Empress Eugenie.
