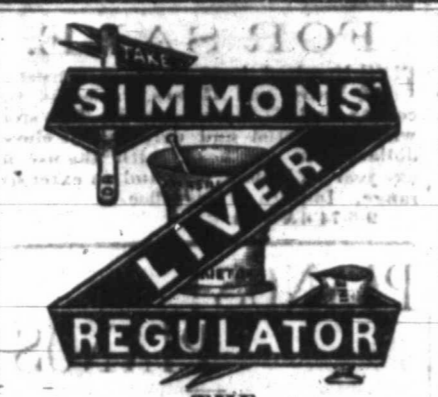

President Grant's View of the Financial Problem.

Senator Jones has obtained permission from President Grant to publish the following memorandum, prepared by the latter, expressing his views upon the financial questions: "I believe it," says the President, "a high and plain duty to return to a specie basis at the earliest practicable day, not only in compliance with legislative and party pledges, but as a step indispensable to a lasting national prosperity."

1. I would like to see the legal tender clause repealed. The repeal would affect at once all contracts made for the date for wages, sales, etc., limited in coin. It would correct our notions of values. The specie dollar would be the only dollar known as a measure of equivalent.

And apparent prosperity there is little demand for coin, and then it will flow out to a market where it can be made to earn something, which it can't do while lying idle. Gold, like anything else, when not needed becomes a surplus, and, like every other surplus, it seeks a market where it can find one.

GEN. J. B. ROBERTSON, the new Commissioner of Immigration, publishes a request to all newspapers friendly to the immigration interest

of the State, to publish a synopsis of the law approved the 30th of April 1874, by the provisions of which the alternate sections of all lands surveyed by railroad companies and set apart for the benefit of the common school fund, as also the lands given by the State for the benefit of the State University, and those granted to the Lunatic, Blind, and Deaf and Dumb Asylums, are now put in market to actual settlers, and can be purchased in tracts of 160 acres or less by immigrants at a minimum price of \$1.50 per acre, the purchaser having ten years to pay for them; that is, he is required to pay the interest and one-tenth of the principal yearly for ten years, with the privilege of paying the whole of the principal at any time, provided he may desire to do so sooner and get his full title.

The Commissioner makes this request because "the Legislature has made no adequate appropriation to enable the Bureau to meet the requirements made on it." We shall cheerfully work in the great immigration interest of the State; but we cannot help remarking that the present administration seems to be fatally destructive of our free school interest, our immigration interest, our financial credit, and of the preservation of law and order in the State. Under Governor Davis all these interests were promoted.

The New Ocean Cable.

The latest dispatches inform us that the ocean steamer Faraday, the largest steamship in the world except the Great Eastern, and named after the great Professor, had arrived at Portsmouth, N. H., and that there was general rejoicing in consequence. She brings the western end of the new telegraph line of Messrs. Siemens Brothers, which is to connect Ireland with New York by a direct line. The Direct United States-Cable Company, which is believed to be an amalgamation of the old Atlantic and Newfoundland Companies, have ordered an improved cable of Messrs. Siemens Brothers, which is to be laid across from Ireland to Nova Scotia, and thence, through the Bay of Fundy and New York.

THE RAIN JETTY plan for removing the obstructions at the mouth of the Mississippi has been defeated in the House, and the St. Philip Canal plan adopted. The sum of \$5,000 has been appropriated. The House has also passed a dredging bill, authorizing the Secretary of War to advertise for bids, and to expend \$15,000 a month for maintaining 30 ft. depth, to pay \$2,000 for each additional foot, until twenty-seven feet of water is reached, and to make this contract for five years, subject to revocation at the discretion of the Secretary under three months' notice. The Senate has not yet acted on these bills.

The boys then withdrew to a safe distance, to await reinforcements. A large party left Goliad immediately for the scene of conflict.

LOCAL AFFAIRS.

THE WELLS of San Antonio produce water almost as cold as ice water. Just before writing this, at 1:30 o'clock, we took a drink of water just drawn from the well at Schmitt's Hotel, which was almost cold enough to make our teeth ache. The water in this city is "hard" water, being limestone, and to a new comer is not as satisfactory as soft water, from spring, well or cistern. But this soon passes away, and it quenches thirst as fully as free stone water. Most of the wells here are colder than the very best elsewhere in Houston or Galveston, even where they shut off the summer rains, and drink only the winter water. And water is so easily reached, and is so near the surface, that everybody can have wells. Then the supply is abundant, more so than in any other place we have ever seen, and it is never-failing and eye-pleasing. We have enough water to supply New York, London, and Paris.

A HYGIENIC INSTITUTION in the neighborhood of this city was recently proposed in these columns. We notice that some physician in the region of Boerne, Kendall county, has had the same idea, and has acted on it. This confirms us in the importance of our own suggestion. San Antonio, or the near neighborhood of the city, is just as healthy as it is in any part of all this section of Western Texas. We are situated at the foot-hills of the mountain region. We have abundant springs, and never-failing and beautiful streams of water. We have beautiful scenery. We have a dry, salubrious, invigorating atmosphere.

And then, were such an institution located within easy access of this city, it would possess facilities for obtaining supplies, medicines, lumber, materials, workmen, servants, skilled nurses and cooks, and medical attention, that could not be procured far in the country. Books, newspapers, society, amusements, churches, attentive friends, mails and telegraph lines, would all be advantages possessed by an institution near the city which could not be enjoyed in the interior.

Moreover, San Antonio has an attraction in its ancient name, and romantic history, and unique position and scenery which give it the preference with health and pleasure seekers over all other parts of Western Texas. THE House has refused to take up the Civil Rights bill, and it is believed that the measure is dead for this session of Congress. We trust so. We need no more race legislation in this country. Equal civil and political rights are secured to all citizens, and the whites of the South need as much protective legislation as the blacks. Let race legislation and race prejudices now come to an end.

THE PUBLIC DEBT, according to the statement just published, was reduced during the last month \$4,456,838. This is not equal to the monthly reduction previous to the panic, but it is gratifying to know there is a decrease of the debt, and that the treasury department is in a position to use spare funds for that purpose. The treasury has recovered from the shock, as we hope the country has, in a great measure. Detaching the coin certificates (\$33,179,500) there was a balance of coin in the treasury of \$48,779,489 and a currency balance of \$11,177,708. The outstanding legal tenders remained at \$382,000,000. The gold sales for the month of June are to be \$5,000,000, in four instalments—namely, on the 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th of the month.

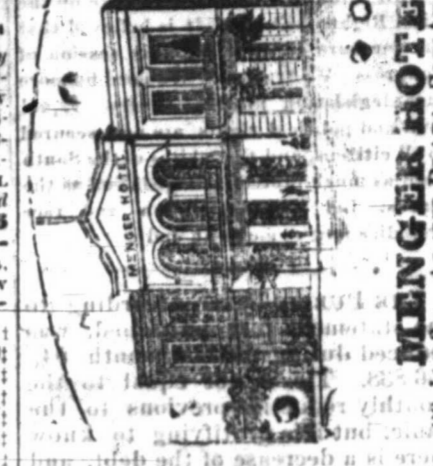
