SIR-Your note received. The Legislature have made ample provisions for the payment of the public debt. It only remains for the Executive to act and carry out the law. I will do it promptly, and the debt will be paid within the next hundred days. I mean what I say.

The one hundred days within which the Governor promised to have the money in the treasury to to pay the floating debt of Texas as fast as the warrants could be presented at the counter expired on the 19th inst. It is now the 23d of June. But the State agent at New York, ¥r. Moody, has not negotiated the \$1,000,000 required to be sold for payment of the floating debt, nor has the alternative of getting an advance upon them at a reasonable

rate of interest been effected. Warrants have accumulated at Austin in great numbers, it is said, on the strength of the Governor's highly promising programme. Confiding holders chose to test the pro mise that every rightful debt against the State should be worth every dollar it called for, and that every honest creditor should have his money without a cent of discount if he would only keep his warrant for a hundred days. All that you need to do is to advance money enough on the crop to carry it through to bearing, and if it is not mortgaged to you, it is morally bound to come here. Commission men in New Orleans have built up colossal fortunes in a few years, handling cotton in this way. There is no way of building up a fortune like it."

Paris, June 19 .- The Right is deeply discouraged by recent votes in the Assembly. It feels that its power is gone, and that the majority, which it has hitherto been able to command, is broken up. The Left Centre is determined to make a charge on the domestic policy of the gov-

WACO AFFAIRS. - Our citizens being invited to vote. on next Friday, an increase of city taxes, a few dots retrospective and of present management of city affairs may not be uninteresting.

Under Republican administration the city tax in 1870 was \$5000; in 1871, \$7500; in 1872 \$9000. Last year (Democratic) it was \$14,000; this year Mayor Long informs us it is \$12,000.

During the four years of Republican administration, from 1869 to 1872, the city bought a lot for \$100 and erected thereon the Mayor's office and calaboose, costing over \$4000 : built seven good bridges in different parts of the city, costing from \$500 to \$2700 each ; graded and macadamized Austin street, bringing it from the muddlest and most ill conditioned street in the city to the best-the best and most important work of street improvement that has ever been done in the city Democratic administration has bought a steam fire engine and agreed to pay \$7500 and has built some cisterns, and opened several streets.

Republican administration left city scrip worth from 80 to 90 cents on the dollar; it is worth now from 20 to 30

Mayor Long's report puts the city indebtedness at \$29,000.

When Mr. Compton was City Marshal (Republican administration) he acted as Chief of Police, Street Commissioner and boss of hands. Now these are made scaprate positions and paid for.

They rent a building for an engine bouse paying \$720 a year when the city owns a lot (next to Mayor's office) and has one wall built and could build an engine house for less than a year's rent.

The city government employed a lawyer in Waco to collect the city railroad tax; in Austin they have employed a firm to fight it in the Federal Court -- [Waco Reg.




