Perhaps one of the most important measures passed by Congressmen Morey's bill authorizing the President to appoint a commission of engineers, composed of three ar my and two civil engineers, to report at the next session, through the President, a plan for the per-manent reclamation and redemption of the alluvial mess of the river. The board will probably consist of the following officers of the army: General G. K. Warren, United States Engineer; General H. L. Ab bott, United States Engineer; Maj. W. H. B. Benyard, United States Engineer. The civil engineers are Governor Paul O. Hebert, of Lonisiana, and John Sickfes, of Ark.

NEW YORK, June 25 .- A letter from Havana dated the 20th inst., says that the prospects are that a general repudiation of the bills of the Spanish bank will take effect next week.

If this should really take place, and become general, there would be many failures.

Several cigar manufacturers have notified their customers that after next week they will not receive paper money, but will demand gold or silver.

HAVANA, June 26.-An address has been presented to Captain General Concha, signed by business men of all branches of trade, representing that in view of the tright ful condition of the financial affairs, which threatens the ruin of the country, and menaces the authority of his excellency, it is the duty of every good Spaniard to come to the aid of the government with such resources as be can command.

Gold to day is quoted at 292, and will undoubtedly soon reach 1000, if a speedy and supreme effort is not made to check the rise. The rates of foreign exchange, like those of gold, are also going up indefinitely. 
