COKE'S PROCLAMATION, instead of doing any good in the way of suppressing lawlessness and crime, seems to have added fresh fuel to the flame of violence that now ravages the State.

Insults more emphatic than these were never hurled at a Chief Executive. If not promptly and effectively resented, they will be as humiliating as they have been flagrant.

Coke should resign at once. The State is being ruined, and he is not only worthless to prevent it, but he is himself the inspiration of the agencies of ruin.

THE BEECHER-TILTON SCANDAL has been recently revived. Mr. Beecher, as is well known, is the most notable and popular preacher in the United States, and pastor of Plymouth Church, Brooklyn.

Having suffered in silence for four years from these and similar misrepresentations, and before the public by the Plymouth Church, Tilton says that neither patience or duty will permit him longer to conceal the actual facts from the public.

Mr. Tilton gives his reason for severing his connection with the Church as follows: After I had been for fifteen years a member of the Plymouth Church, and had become meanwhile an intimate friend of the pastor, knowledge came to me in 1870 that he had committed against me a crime which I forbear to name or characterize. Prompted

by my self respect, I immediately and forever ceased my attendance upon his ministry.

Then follows the extract of a letter or document signed by Beecher, which is as follows:

BROOKLYN, JUN. 11, 1871. I ask Theodore Tilton's forgiveness, and humble myself before him as I do before my God. He would have been a better man in my circumstances than I have been.

Tilton closes his letter thus: "The injurious measure which the author of this apology has since permitted his church to take against me without protest on his part, involving a gross injury to me, which have been greatly aggravated by your writings, has put me before my countrymen in a character which I trust is foreign to my nature and life, and render the accumulating weight of this odium unjustly bestowed on me, that which neither patience nor charity can demand that I submit to."

BREKHAM, June 25.—Several prisoners convicted of penitentiary offences at the late session of the District Court made a desperate effort to escape last night at 10 o'clock. The plan was to force the locks with tools smuggled in, and then kill the jailer and escape.

The nine prisoners recently convicted started for Huntsville in the morning train. One of them is sentenced to a life term for murder.

Joe T. Irvin, charged with killing W. T. Fisher, near Ledbetter, is now in jail. His cousin, Tom Irvin, shot Joe, Brown at the same place a day or two ago, and has not been arrested yet.

There is too much shooting and killing going on, and the courts of the State must put a stop to it if possible.

ACRIZ, June 25.—Judge Ferris temporarily occupied a seat in the Supreme Court this morning.

The International Railroad bond case was set for Tuesday next.

 DISTRICT COURT.—Judge Noonan, hav-  
 ing returned from Castroville, resumed  
 his seat on the bench this morning. Judge  
 Ware, who had so satisfactorily presided  
 in his place during the past week, not  
 being on duty, was seated within the bar.  
 Some cases were expected to come up of  
 such great interest that the court room  
 was filled as soon as court opened.  
 The case of the State against Ankerson,  
 deputy sheriff, for contempt, in allowing  
 Huebner, deputy sheriff, charged with  
 murder of Bliker, to leave jail and go  
 about the country armed, was called by  
 District Attorney Green. Col. Anderson,  
 of counsel for defense in the case of Hueb-  
 ner and Borman, for murder of Bliker,  
 insisted on the trial of the writ of *habeas*  
*corpus* in their case. The State alleged  
 the absence of a material witness. The  
 court decided to allow the prisoners tempo-  
 rary bail, to give the State time for the  
 production of this witness. The mystery  
 and the excitement about this case have  
 become so great that the crowd increases  
 every time it comes up. Justice demands  
 an exhaustive examination of it. The  
 public demand it.  
 This important case, which was delayed  
 until Judge Noonan's return, having been  
 again delayed, he vacated the bench, and  
 Judge Ware took it.
