## General News.

LONDON, June 17.—Advices from  
Algiers state that the Moorish in-  
surgents invaded that city, but were  
repulsed by the French troops. Twelve of the insurgents were killed  
and a number were wounded.

PARIS, June 17.—In a fight at  
Algiers thirty-seven Moors, insur-  
gents, were killed and the loss of  
French troops was six killed and  
ten wounded.

LONDON, June 16th.—The Daily  
Telegraph has a special dispatch from  
Central Asia announcing that a re-  
bellion has broken out in Khokan.  
Sixteen officials of high rank have  
been beheaded.

The Russian commanders in Cen-  
tral Asia have received orders to re-  
main neutral.

ROME, June 15.—The American  
pilgrims are highly pleased with  
their reception. The Pope has blessed  
the banner, sent by Georgetown  
College to be presented to the shrine  
of the Virgin at Lourdes. Some of  
the pilgrims are going to Venice, to  
attend the Catholic congress now  
in session there.

## Texas News.

The Pleasanton Stock Journal had  
to throw a drunken loafer named Shaw  
in the street, who was approaching him  
armed. Shaw is chained in jail, in default  
of \$25.

COL. S. G. NEWTON'S death is deplored  
by a large portion of the press of Texas.

On Saturday night about eight o'clock  
Nasario Rodriguez brought to Justice  
Smith one Pancha Flores, that had stolen  
a mare from said Rodriguez. The latter  
followed the trail of Flores from San Mi-  
guel to the Atascosa creek near Robert  
Ingle's, where he found him asleep, recov-  
ered his mare, and brought the thief to  
Pleasanton.

LAST week our little Minnie, aged two  
and a half years, while playing on the  
bank of the La Guanesa with some small  
children, the oldest of whom was but four  
years old, fell into the stream which was  
about three feet deep. Her little play-  
fellow gave the alarm, and when help  
arrived, the little half-drowned child was  
crawling out on the other side. How she  
succeeded in crossing the stream, which  
was for at least ten feet beyond her depth,  
will always remain a mystery. She was  
taken from the water in an almost insens-  
ible condition, and for some hours there-  
after was very sick.—Stock Journal.

committed suicide by shooting himself  
through the head with a pistol. He was  
buried hurriedly upon his death and 'tis  
talked that a more strict investigation  
should have been held by a Jury of in-  
quest with an attendant physician.

Burglaries are so common in Houston  
that loud complaint of the police is made.

lawless condition of the county, and are  
trying to sell their town property. He al-  
so reports that there are about one hun-  
dred and fifty armed men with the Taylor  
party, and nearly two hundred with the  
Sutton party, and a collision is expected  
daily.

CHICAGO, June 24.—The ceremony of laying the corner stone of the new government building to day drew an immense attendance. Strangers are here from all parts of the State. Business has been entirely suspended. The Board of Trade and public offices are closed, and the streets filled with people in holiday attire. The procession was a very fine one, including a very large number of Knights Templar and other Masonic bodies. The procession has been forming all the morning. At 10:30 it got under way, with the Arsenal band, from Jefferson Barracks, leading. The procession was four miles long, and the route marched was over 3 miles. The laying of the corner-stone of the new Custom-house and Post-office was witnessed by not less than 20,000 people, gathered in the immediate vicinity, while the number of strangers in the city is estimated to have been as high as 100,000. 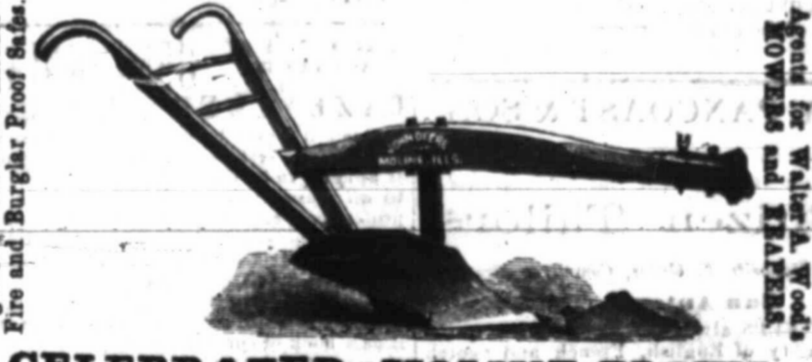
