Gov. Kemper on Gen. Grant.

Gov. Kemper published in the Richmond papers a letter, of which the following are extracts:

I do not believe the country can remain in its present abnormal condition. We are going to have either popular self-government or central imperialism. I intend to stand for the liberty side as long as a fragment of it remains. I am opposed to a third term for the reason that, notwithstanding the past, I have faith in the cause of constitutional free government; but I oppose some other evils still more. One of the cruelest calamities which could befall all classes and colors at the South would be the social intermixing of the races, to result from the enforcement of the civil rights fanaticism and barbarism, and it is hard to conceive what greater evil than that could be involved in any possible revolution of the government. If the future should bring forward a candidate impersonating the third term principle, if he should cut loose from old party trammels and take his stand on our safe, conservative ground of universal reconciliation and peace under the constitution, and if, so standing, he should be opposed by any champion of the civil rights iniquity, then, in a contest between the two, the conservative party ought, in my opinion, to go decidedly, but as an organized party, and not otherwise, for the third termer, yet with a protest on their lips against the third term principle and in spite of that principle.

The Governor recites the circum-Grant in Washington shortly after Send stamp for l'amphiets, free. Governor Kemper's inauguration, which occasioned much comment at the time. This visit, he says, was one of courtesy, made in response to a courteous invitation from the President that the Governor should call and make his acquaintance, and in making the call he claims that he was only carrying out the Virginia conservative platform, which pledged the party to judge every act of Gen. Grant on its own merits. He remarks:

I went, because under my convictions of duty and propriety, I made up my mind to go, and under circumstances to justify it again, I should go again. I went and had a manly square talk with the President, and while I shall not so violate propriety as to allude to its par ticulars, yet I regret that every word of it could not have been taken down and published, for, although I say it, its publication would have done credit to him and to me, and no discredit and no harm to any part of the country or the people. As to the Federal Executive head. I shall render him, hot factions hostility, but a fair and unprejudiced judgment. For the sake of ourselves and the whole country, I shall rejoice if he so emulates the example of Washington; if he so aids in restoring the landmarks of the constitution, lately overthrown spects the right of the States and the people to self-government, as to by the violence of arms; if he so recommand our united and hearty support or the whole of his future administration. So far as his influ ence has saved us from the degra. Arrival and Departure of Mails dation of the test oaths and the Civil Rights law; so tar as he has tralizing and dangerous powers of the Enforcement act, he is entitled to our gratitude and support. In conclusion, Governor Kemper transmits copies of his letters to Colonel Mosby, written during the Gubernatorial campaign last autumn. The only noticeable passage in these is the following:

FIRST SESSION OF THE FOR TYTHERD CONGRESS.

GENERAL NATURE NO. 25.1 AN ACT relative to private contracts or ingreements made with Indians prior to May twenty-first, eighteen hundred and

Be it enacted by the Senate and Moue of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That hereafter it shall not be lawful for any United States officer, or other person ha der its employ or control, to recognize the binding force of tegality, or in any man-wer an early or enforce or connect, or give any aid or assistance to sustain or enforce, any contract or agreement made by any person or persons, or corporation, with any band, wibe, or nation of Indians, or individual Indian or Indians, not a citizen of the United States, entered into prior to the date of the act of Congress entitled "An act regulating the mode of making purete contracts with Indians," approed May twenty-first, cighteen hundred and seventy-two, for the payment or de-livery of any money or other thing of value, in present or prospective, or for the

corporation, in consideration of services for, or advancements made to, said Indiana relative to the least of demand, or thing under laws or treaties with the United States, or official acts of any officer thereof, or it any way connected with or due from the United States, nnder such contract or agreement was re-duced to writing and duly signed by the parties in interest thereto at the time it was entered into and fully made known to the purities at the time the contract was signed, and then not until such original written contract shall first have been prosented to and examined by the Secretary of the Interior and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and these facts by them severally endorsed thereon, and a copy of said contract and of any assignments that may have been mide thereon duly entered of record in the office of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

SEC. 2. That in addition thereto there

shall also be filed in said Commissioner's Office, and retained therein as official Office, and retained therein as official papers, and be examined by said Commissioner and Secretary, and that fast indorsed on them, the following statement of facts touching each and all such contracts and agreements to presented; which statements shall be sworn to specially by all and severally the personser persons claiming interest in and seeking the support and enforcement of such contract or agreement, and not by agent or attorney: First, that the writing presented for examination and record, as provided for in the first section of this act, and purporting to be the original contract or agreement, is the fact such, and that it was entered into and reduced to writing at the date and for the purposes it purports to date and for the purposes it purports to have been made sud executed: secondly, such sworn statement shall give particu-larly the names of the real parties in interest in the original contract or agreement, maning them if not unued in the written contract or agreement, and if either of the contracting parties is a band, tribe, or nation of Indians, or a corporattion or firm, the name of the person of ficer, or agent contracting in their behalf, together with his authority for so doing, shall be specially stated; thirdly, a particular statement of all and singular the services rendered or the thing or things done under such contract or agreement prior to said filing, with those things to be done arrended together with a part-icular statement of any and all moneys paid or advanced by either party under cases the the time, place, and real value of services rendered, or thing or things done, or the kind and manner of panment, done, or the kind and manner of paument, whether in money, property, or credits, up to the date of the filing of the said sworn statement; fourthly, state specifically whether the original contract or agreement had been submitted to any Secretary of the Interior; Commissioner of Indian Affairs, imperintendent of Indian affairs, Indian agent, commissioner, or other person having official control or connection with Indian affairs, giving the time when, place when, and person by name to whom such authorisation was made, and whether by said officer indorsed or and whether by sail officer indorsed or not, or wether any such officer was cog-nizant of such contract or agreement having been made, though not submitted to him for approval.


