OUR AUSTIN LETTER.

The Newcomb Case - A Clear Case of Political Persecution -The State Continues, &c. AUSTIN, July 18, 1874.

Your readers have read of the charges made against Mr. Newcomb, former Secretary of State, by the smelling committee of the 14th Legislature. From the inception to the present time this prost-cution has been a piece of mean, malignant political persecution. It had its origin in the Executive office. The Legislature appropriated \$500 and placed it at Coke's disposal to persecute with: Coke employed Walton and Shelly, who were acting as the attornies of Green. This man Green had been arrested upon several charges of forgery. Green was induced to become the swearing tool of Coke, upon a promise of immunity from panishment. Shelly and Walton made a good, thing out of it by receiving the \$500 from the State and a couple of thousand and from Green. Green was drilled for a couple of weeks, and then Newcomb was arrested and arraigned before a pig-headed Coke Justice of the Peace, and for three weeks a most persistent effort was made to put him in jail. Charges were multiplied, - bonds were rejected and new bonds were required,-but at last the Legislature adjourned and the persecution let up. The public took no interest in this prosecution, impression gained ground daily that the victim selected was incapable of the of- ble. st him, and that the whole thing had been gotten up to blacken the reputation of the last administra-

Green was released from arrest on the charges against him, and placed under bond to appear as a witness, and a few days afterwards abscouded in company with a fellow named Van Eps, who had been used to corroborate Green's perjuries. The manner in which Green left was ex tremely suspicious, and it is quite certain is said to have left behind written at ments, one of which was in the pres-of witnesses, in which he denied all rehe had sworn to before Justice Smith, and stated that he had actell as he had in or der to clear himself.
