Grant at heart was always a good Confederate, differing from Lee only in the accident of having been thrown by geographical facts and political forces on another track in the outset of the "unpleasantness." It is evident that many of our Southern contemporaries are by no means oppressed with the idea of a third term for Grant. Perhaps Judge Pierpont did not utter the wildest of predictions when he said that Grant would be reelected with the support of Southern Democrats.—Galveston News.

Gen. Bertrand recently gave to the Prince Imperial, at Chiselhurst, a watch which formerly belonged to the First Napoleon, and which he gave to an ancestor of Bertrand. Napoleon's words on giving the watch are engraved inside the case. They are as follows: "This is the one," said his Majesty, "which I wore at Rivoli. I drew it from my pocket at two in the morning, and said to Joubert: 'Come attack. Day has not yet broken.'"

Massenet de Marancourt, ex-Communist, condemned to transportation, escaped from Paris and France dressed as a commandant of gendarmes. He inspected every post of the gendarmerie between Paris and the frontier on the line of the Eastern Railway.

Mr. and Mrs. Justus Ackley, of Rome, have been married sixty-eight years. Mr. Ackley will be 103 years old in August, and his wife is twenty years younger. Nine children have been born to them, and all are living. The oldest boy is sixty five.

The Khedive of Egypt has, by treaty, agreed to establish a Supreme Court, having jurisdiction of all international cases, the members to rank next to the Khedive's family, and to be nominated by England, France and the United States. President Grant has appointed as the American member of the court, Victor Barringer, of North Carolina, who was lately a member of the commission to revise and codify the laws.

Capt. Geo. Mc Pherson, of Washington county, Tennessee, has a fine Ayrshire cow, which has given from May 14 to June 14, by accurate weight, 2,040 pounds of milk. The smallest amount given any one day in the month was 56 1/2 pounds, and the largest amount in a day was 71 pounds.


