

Davis was displaced there was something over \$150,000 available school fund in the Treasury. Since that \$160,000 have been paid in as interest, and one fourth the general revenue, making in all something over \$400,000 available school fund, and about \$300,000 general revenue. This money business is kept a secret. No showing has been made since Coke came into office. But persons well posted say that the available school fuml has been exhausted, used for general revenue purposes, and that Coke contem out claiming or trying to show that plates using the permanent school fund to save himself, which accounts for the desperate efforts to sell bonds or borrow money abroad. Mean while, the price of State warrants has fallen below the lowest quotation of Gov. Davis administration.
