

Kansas has had to bear the brunt of the raids, however. Lone Wolf, the chief whose son became such a friend to Gen. Custar, as parrated in the July Galaxy, is at the head of one of these bands, and Kicking Bird and Big Tree are also out, Santanta, on the contrary, has staid on his reservation by the agency, and is content to draw his coffee and sugar, and leave war alone for the present. CAUTION NECESSARY .- When the news of the horrible marder of the two young ladies in New Braunfels reached us, through the telegram of Mayor Kessler, who stated that the murderer was sup posed to have come in the direction of San Antonio, Detective Lyons, of this city, went out and stationed himself at the store of Mr. Henry Bitters, to watch all coming from that direction. Mr. Plummer arrived and informed him that he and others had trailed a negro man from New Braunfels, and that he had entered Maverick's field. Whereupon, both approached the house of the colored man, when he, seeing men coming, and probably armed, ran for the bushes. This was very natural since two negroes have been recently hung on the Austin road by lynch law. who, we are informed, had committed outrageous crimes, and deserved the full penalty of the law- but not of the mob. Refusing to obey the call to stop, Mr. Plummer fired, and Detective Lyons says he fired then in the air, and called on those at Mr. Jones' store to assist in arresting the man.

Now, this colored man, we are informed, was at his own house, and had not been out of the neighborhood in eight or ten days previously. There was no ground for supposing him to be the murderer; there was no charge against him ; be was at his own house; there was no warrant for his arrest; and, when alarmed, he ran off, he was fired at by one, and another fired to frighten him into stopping; but the negro thought both pistols were intended to kill him. He has not yet returned home, and his family are in distress

The Free Press (German) noticed the case, and criticized the proceeding, kindly but justly. Detective Lyone, thereupon, takes the criticism, which is wholly in the public interest, and the right and duty of a public journal, as a personal offense, and writes the editor of the Free Press a vulgarly and abusive letter, using epithets for which men are daily fined before the Recorder. 
