**TWO NEGLECTED CROPS.**  
We refer to barley and buck-  
wheat.  
The extraordinary increase in the  
consumption of lager beer and other  
malt liquors, has caused a correspond-  
ing increase in the amount of barley  
needed by the brewer. During the  
past few years, the requirements of  
the beer trade in this city have drawn  
barley here, not only from most of the  
Northern States, Utah and California,  
but from the British Provinces. What is  
stranger still, barley has been brought  
here for malting purposes, from remote  
portions of Continental Europe. As com-  
pared with wheat, and other grains  
suited to like climates and soils, it has  
steadily increasing in value. At present,  
the price of barley is almost as high as  
that of wheat, and but for the supplies  
that come from the distant West, the  
price of barley would be greater than  
that of wheat. Much the same state of  
things exists in England.—Chicago  
Prairie Farmer.  
It seems strange to us that with such  
a demand for barley as is made man-  
ifest in the above, no more of that grain  
is produced in Western Texas. We be-  
lieve that it could be produced in the  
greatest abundance, and brought to the  
greatest perfection, in almost every part  
of Western Texas. By the time the next  
crop could be harvested, we shall have  
railroad transportation from San Antonio,  
and the world will be open to us. We sug-  
gest to all our farmers to put in a barley  
crop the coming season.  
Western Texas will also produce  
buckwheat, we think. Of this crop, the  
Prairie Farmer says:  
With a favorable season scarcely  
any crop pays as well as buckwheat.  
The cost of seed, only two or three  
pecks being required for an acre, is  
trifling. As it requires but 60 or 70  
days in which to mature, it may be  
sown at a season of the year in which  
farm work is not drying. If frosts are  
not serious till the first of October,  
a crop of buckwheat may be harvested  
from land not yet plowed. The grain is  
of the best quality when it matures in  
the cool weather of the fall.  
The demand for buckwheat in-  
creases every year, and it would seem  
that the amount produced decreases.  
The supply of what passes for buck-  
wheat flour is kept up by the use of  
wheat and rye middlings. Pure buck-  
wheat flour is unknown in the city  
market, and the report is that country  
millers never grind a grist of buck-  
wheat in the presence of their custom-  
ers. The temptation to adulterate the  
flour with wheat middlings is too great  
for even the honest millers in the coun-  
try. Genuine buckwheat flour would  
sell at almost any price asked for it,  
and some of our associated farmers  
could not do a better thing than to  
provide the market with a supply.

At present, General Beauregard is

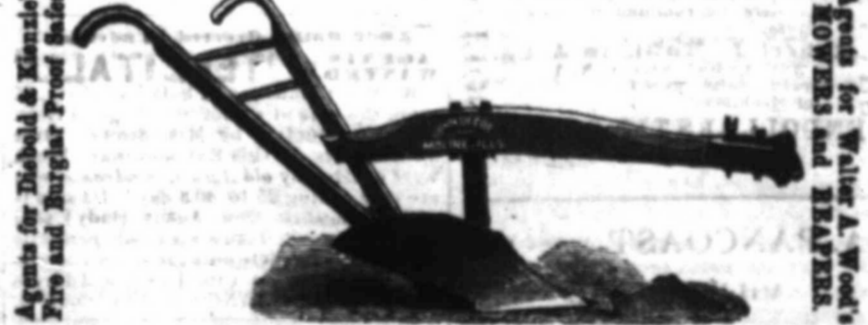
