

THE NEW BRAUNFELS TRAGEDY .- The Galveston News has a special from New Braunfels, which increases the mystery of the terrible murder there. It says that it is evident, from all the facts that have been gathered, that the murder was intended for Mrs. Faust; but Miss Voelcker who was sleeping in the same room, woke up from the noise the murderer made in striking Mrs. Fanst, and he was afraid of being recognized, and then killed Misa Voelcker to keep her from being a witness against him. Miss Voeleker's head was split from ear to ear, and Mrs. Paust was cut once across the eyes, when she raised and cried out aloud, and was pressed down again by the murderer and then received another ent in the forehend.

The murderer was a white man, as the little brother of Miss Voelcker, who was sleeping in the next room, awoke from the noise and commanded, in German words, the man to go out. He was so cool and composed that he did not turn his face toward the boy, but ran out a short distance. The murder was well planned.

Mrs. Faust must have been watched closely for a day or two. A man was seen walking up and down before Mr Voelcker's house, but nothing was suspicioned in a quiet village as this has been. Mr. Faust was absent at Seguin. Mrs. Faust was afraid to stop in her house by herself, and always has shown a certain fear while her husband was not with her, and she had now been sleeping the second night at Mr. Voelcker's. The first night Mrs. P. and Miss V. went to bed together; but the London. night the murder took place Mrs. F. went to bed by herself, while Miss V. went to the dancing school-of which the murderer took advantage; but the moon was hisning so bright he waited until after one o'clock, when it had gone down. Miss V. returned a quarter past twelve, and had hardly alept half so hour when the tragedy took place. Mrs F. had such a fear that she would not sleep alone anywhere; Mr. Voeleker's daughter had to stay in her room, and his little son in the room next

All these facts show that the marder was intended for Mrs. Faust alose, and that she apprehended that danger. What was the cause of her fear, and who was the cause of it! If she lives to testify, the truth will come out, and the murderer. will have failed to cover his tracks.


