General News.

Catholics—will remain in Jerusalem
seven years longer. Her sole com-
panions in the little cottage where
she lives are a dog and cat.
ESMERALDA Cervantes, the harp-
ist and protege of ex Queen Isabella,
is in London. The Countess de Paula,
in an article published in the Lon-
don "Cosmopolitan" says she met Es-
meralda in that city, and that her
playing is wonderful. She is only
thirteen, and Spanish by birth.
SENOR Francisco V. Aguilera,
President of the Republic of Cuba,
Salvador Cisneros, Secretary of the
Republic, and Senor Zaldivar,
attache, were in Jacksonville, Flor-
ida, recently, on business connect-
ed with affairs in Cuba.
ALFONSO, Prince of the Asturias,
and Pretender of Spain, has left the
College of Vienna and joined the
University of Louvain in Belgium.
GEN. Ord has received instruc-
tions from the War Department to
prepare at once plans and specifica-
tions for the new bridge to be con-
structed across the Platte river near
Fort Laramie.
WHILE Gen. Beauregard is in-
vited to go out to the Argentine
Republic to be its chief engineer,
Sir John Hawkshaw, the eminent
English engineer, has accepted an
invitation from the Emperor of
Brazil to come over and survey the
coast from Pernambuco to Campos
—a distance of five thousand miles
—with a view to select new coast
harbors and depots for railways to
the interior. A part of Sir John's
staff is now on the way to Brazil.

THE growth of trade with the
Gulf cities of Texas is remarkably
rapid. Early this week ten car
loads of grain and a number of car
loads of other products were for-
warded, and yesterday parties on
change were making up another
shipment of equal magnitude. Beside
these shipments, many smaller
ones are being made daily, and a
number of Texas men are here buy-
ing and forwarding to the houses
at home. —Kansas City Journal of
Commerce, 25th.

New York, July 28.—The Beecher
Investigation Committee resumed
its session this evening, as usual,
with closed doors. Beyond the fact
that two or three witnesses were
examined, nothing is known con-
cerning its proceedings.
New York, July 28.—The Sun
says the Beecher Committee decid-
ed last evening to call Moulton as
the next witness, asking him in their
invitation to produce all documents
in his possession that relate in any
way to the case. Mr. Tilton says
Moulton will not testify before the
committee as now constituted. Mr.
Sherman last evening, said no
testimony of Tilton's, bearing on
alleged confessions of Mr. Beecher
to him of adultery, was even elicited
in repeated cross-examination, or
omitted in the publication of it.
Beecher's Stenographer says no
such testimony as Tilton speaks of
in his card, was regularly presented
before the committee. Beecher
returned from Peekskill yesterday,
and chatted pleasantly with some of
his church members on the door-
steps in the evening. If Moulton
does not answer the call to testify,
which he will receive to day, Bee-
cher's testimony will be taken with-
out further delay.

THE NEW BRAUNFELS TRAGEDY.—The Galveston News has a special from New Braunfels, which increases the mystery of the terrible murder there. It says that it is evident, from all the facts that have been gathered, that the murder was intended for Mrs. Faust; but Miss Voelcker who was sleeping in the same room, woke up from the noise the murderer made in striking Mrs. Faust, and he was afraid of being recognized, and then killed Miss Voelcker to keep her from being a witness against him. Miss Voelcker's head was split from ear to ear, and Mrs. Faust was cut once across the eyes, when she raised and cried out aloud, and was pressed down again by the murderer and then received another cut in the forehead.

The murderer was a white man, as the little brother of Miss Voelcker, who was sleeping in the next room, awoke from the noise and commanded, in German words, the man to go out. He was so cool and composed that he did not turn his face toward the boy, but ran out a short distance. The murder was well planned.

Mrs. Faust must have been watched closely for a day or two. A man was seen walking up and down before Mr. Voelcker's house, but nothing was suspected in a quiet village as this has been. Mr. Faust was absent at Seguin. Mrs. Faust was afraid to stop in her house by herself, and always has shown a certain fear while her husband was not with her, and she had now been sleeping the second night at Mr. Voelcker's. The first night Mrs. F. and Miss V. went to bed together; but the night the murder took place Mrs. F. went to bed by herself, while Miss V. went to the dancing school—of which the murderer took advantage; but the moon was shining so bright he waited until after one o'clock, when it had gone down. Miss V. returned a quarter past twelve, and had hardly slept half an hour when the tragedy took place. Mrs. F. had such a fear that she would not sleep alone anywhere; Mr. Voelcker's daughter had to stay in her room, and his little son in the room next to them.

All these facts show that the murder was intended for Mrs. Faust alone, and that she apprehended that danger. What was the cause of her fear, and who was the cause of it? If she lives to testify, the truth will come out, and the murderer will have failed to cover his tracks.

UNITED STATES. PASSED AT THE FIRST SESSION OF THE FORTY-THIRD CONGRESS.

GENERAL NATURE—No. 55. AN ACT making appropriations for the legislative, executive, and judicial expenses of the Government for the year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and seventy-five, and for other purposes.

SECURITY OF THE BRANCHES.—In the construction of the Treasury: One Assistant Secretary, four thousand dollars; chief clerk, two thousand dollars; book-keeper, two thousand dollars; photographer, two thousand five hundred dollars; assistant photographer, one thousand six hundred dollars; four clerks of class four, one at six hundred dollars each and three at five hundred dollars each; one messenger, four hundred dollars.
