The Cattle Drive.

The cattle drive from Texas into Kansas will number 155,000 and is distributed as follows: 4000 at Coffee ville, 40,000 at Wichita, 25,000, at Great Bend and neighboring points, 50,000 at Ellsworth, 12,000 at Bunker Hill and other places. These will be marketed this fall, while the remaining 24,000 mill be consumed on the frontier in filling Indian contracts. Besides these there are about 100,000 wintered Texans in Kausas and about 40,000 in Colorado, which come into market this season, making altogether about the same number as last year.



SPEECH OF GAMBETTA-DAY FIXED FOR THE ADJOURNMENT OF THE FRENCH ASSEMBLY.

PARIS, August 1 -In the Assembly, today, the question of recess came up for debate. Gambetta made an important speech professedly against prorogation of the session, but really in favor of the Republic. Proregation, he said, was simply intended to conceal the impotence of the Assembly, which, although it arrogated constituent powers, had done nothing but successively reject all known forms of gov ernment. The Right was responsible for whatever might happen. The organization of the Septenate was as impossible as that of the Monarchy.

He made a powerful appeal for the establishment of a republic, which would give peace and union to France, and concluded by moving that the state of siege be raised. The speaker was tumultuously sequent debate the Marquis de Froncliver, Legitimist, declared he considered it his right and duty to do everything in his power to re-establish Monarchy. This caused great excitement and the Left called for the views of government on the subject. Gen. Clasey replied the government would seek with firmness and impartiality to make its powers respected by all parties. The motion as to the state of siege was rejected by a vote of 282 yeas to 366 nays A motion to adjourn on the 18th of August till the 30th of November, was finally carried by a large majority.




