LOCAL AFFAIRS.

THE DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION OF BEXAR County called to elect delegates to the Convention to be held at Goliad on the 26th instant, which is to nominate a candidate for Congress from the Sixth Congressional District, met to day at 11 o'clock A. M., according to call. Maj. Jacob Wael-

On motion the President appointed a committee of five to report the names of suitable delegates to represent the Democracy of this county in the Goliad Convention.

The committee on delegates to the Goliad Convention reported the names of the following gentlemen: Jacob Waelder, W. B. Knox, J. E. Dwyer, H. L. Berg, R. J. Jones, J. C. Crawford, N. O. Green, W. H. Young, H. Pauly, J. H. McCleary, Alejo Montez, Ed. Braden, Geo. Crosson, Ben. Kiolbasa, Luciano Navarro, W. C. Kroeger, Geo. R. Dashell, W. G. Tobin, C. Upson, J. B. Lacoste, Wm. Walters, A. Sierra, W. D. Parish, Jas. R. Sweet, Daniel Devine, H. C. Thompson, E. B. Evans, Frank M. Newton, J. T. Thornton, Sam. Maverick. Thirty delegates in all. Report adopted.

The committee on county executive committee reported the following names: Geo. R. Dashell, J. M. Penaloza, C. Upson, B. Cochran, J. T. Thornton, W. B. Knox, Antoine Gugger, T. Heerman, R. W. Brahan, A. Sierra, W. T. Marshall. Mr. Dashell is Chairman, and Mr. Marshall Treasurer. Report adopted.

Resolutions were then offered instructing the delegates to vote for Major J. T. Brackenridge at the Goliad Convention as the nominee for Congress, and that the majority of the delegation control the whole vote of the county. Gen. Bayler here made quite a sharp speech, charging that eight or ten men in each ward, and not a mass meeting of the party, had directed these instructions. He insisted that the facts go before the Goliad Convention. A substitute was offered expressing an opinion in favor of Maj. Brackenridge, but not instructing. It was laid on the table, and the original resolutions adopted.

A resolution was offered to have the proceedings published in the San Antonio Herald which was amended to include the EXPRESS. After a very humorous and amusing discussion, the amendment was laid on the table. An amendment was then offered to include "all papers friendly to the cause," which was accepted, and the resolution passed. The reporter of the EXPRESS was heard to remark that "nobody could tell what the cause is until after the Goliad Convention." Nevertheless, the EXPRESS, as a good and faithful newspaper for San Antonio and Western Texas, publishes the above from the notes of its own reporter.

On motion a committee of three was appointed to wait on Gov. Stockdale, who is in the city, and invite him to address the people this evening at 8 o'clock. The Convention was composed of the very best of our citizens of the Democratic persuasion, and was well conducted and free from any disturbances. Much of the harmony was due to the admirable manner in which Maj. Waelder presided. The EXPRESS is indebted to the courtesy of the Secretaries for the correct lists of names found in this report.
