Marshal Bazaine's Escape—interesting Particulars—Excite-ment in Marseilles.

LONDON, Aug. 12.—The following interesting particulars of the es cape of Marshal Bazaine, from his prison on the Island of St. Margne rite, has been received. The apartments occupied by Marshal by Bazaine opened upon a lofty and pre cipitate cliff overhanging the sea. A sentry was posted on the terrace with orders to watch the prisoner's every movement.

Sunday evening the Marshal walked upon the terrace with Col. Villette, his aide camp. At two o' clock be retired as usual, apparently to sleep, but before day-break was it discovered that he had affect ed his escape. He must have crossed the terrace in the dead of night, and eluding the sentinel, gained the edge of the precipice; thence, by means of a knotted rope, he descended to the sea. He evidently slipped during the descent, and tore his hands, as the rope was found stained with blood in several places.

Under a clift in a hired boat, were Bazaine's wife and consin. They received him as he reached the water, and Madame La Marechale taking the oars, rowed directly to the strange steamer, which had been Thursday by 6 p. m. 

## LAWS

#### UNITED STATES,

PASSED AT THE

FIRST SESSION OF THE FOR TY THIRD CONGRESS.

GENERAL NATURE-No. 57 AN ACT to antherize the issue of duplicate agricultural land scrip where the original has been lost or destroyed.

He it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the provisions of the act of Congress of the twenty third day of June, eighteen bundred and sixty, telating of the reissue of land warrants in certain cases, be, and the same are hereby, extended so as to in-elude the reisane of ag icultural-college land scrip lost, cancelled or destroyed without the fault of the owner thereof, under such rules and regulations as the Secretary of the Interior may prescribe. Approved, June 20, 1874.

(GENERAL NATURE-No 58.) AN ACT making additions to the fifteenth section of the act approved July 2, 1864, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled "An act to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from the Missouri River to the Pacific Ocean, and to scente to the Government the use of the same for postal military, and other purposes, approved July 1, 1262 "

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. That there shall be, and is hereby, added to the fifteenth section of the set approved July second, eighteen hundred and sixty-foor. entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act to aid is the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from the Missouri River to the Pacific Ocean, and to secure to the Government the use of the same for postal, military and other pur-poses, approved July first, eighteen hun-dred and sixty two," the following words, namely: "And any officer or agent of the companies authorized to construct the aforesaid roods, or any company engaged in operating either of said roads, who chall refuse to operate and use the road or telegraph under his control; or which he is engaged in opera ing for all purposes of communication, travel, and transportation, so far as the public and the Government so far as the pu'lic and the Government are concerned, as one continuous line, or shall refuse, in such operation and use, to afford and secure to each of said reads equal advantages and facilities as to rates, time, or transportation, without any discremination of any kind in favor of, or adverse to, the road or business of any or either of said companies, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, at all be timed in any sum not exceeding one thomand dollars, and not exceeding one thousand dollars, and may be imprison d not less than six mouths. In case of failure or refusal of the Union Pacific Railroad Company, or either of said branches, to comply with the requirements of this act and the acts to which this act is amendatory, the party injured or the company aggrieved may bring an action in the district or circuit court of the United States in the Territory. district, or circuit in which any portion of the road of the defendent may be siruated, for damages on account of such failure or refusal; and, upon recovery, the plaintiff shall be entitled to judgment for treble the amount of all excess of freight and fares collected by the defendant, and for freble the amount of damages sustained by the plaintiff by such failure or refused; and for each and every violation of or failto comply with the requirements of this act, a new cause of action shall arise in case of suit in any such Territory, district, or circuit, process may be served upon any agent of the defendant found in the Territory, district, or circuit in which such suit may be brought, and such service shall be by the court held to be good and anfficient; and it is hereby provided that for all the purposes of said set, and of the acts amendatory thereof, the rail way of the Denver Pacific Railway and Telegraph Company shall be deemed and taken to be a part and extension of the road of the Kansas Pacific Bailroad, to the point of junction thereof with the road of the Union Pacific Railroad Company at Cheyenne, as provided in the act of March third, eighteen hundred and sixty-nue.




