**Wholesale Poisoning.**  
COURTNEY, Aug. 14.—A whole  
sale case of poisoning occurred near  
this place on yesterday. Eleven  
negroes partook of some cornbread  
in which, afterwards it was discovered  
arsenic had been put. One of the  
negroes is dead and two or  
three others are dangerously ill.

**Later.**  
I give the particulars of the poi-  
soning of the negroes. It appears  
from the statement of the negroes,  
that they carried a lot of corn to the  
mill in Hempstead and exchanged  
the same for meal. This they eat  
of and were at once taken sick. It  
is rumored that the negroes broke  
into a certain person's store room  
and stole therefrom flour and meal,  
to add to their repast. Two of the  
negroes are dying and eight or nine  
hardly expected to recover.

**Trial of Russel.**  
PARIS, Aug. 14.—The man Rus-  
sel, who is charged with complicity  
in the San Antonio stage robbery,  
is now before an examining court  
here. The testimony of Morris im-  
plicates Russel in the robbery. It  
has been brought out that Russel  
was in communication with Reed  
since the mail robbery and had been  
assisting him to escape.

**A Murderer Captured.**  
SAN MARCOS, Aug. 13.—Dave  
Baker, who murdered Gus. Ellison,  
at Lockhart, and who escaped from  
the jail of this county some weeks  
ago, was captured in Kansas and  
re-incarcerated here to-day. An  
other murderer, named Sim Tucker,  
who broke jail at the same time  
with Baker, is still at large.

**Canvas of the Second District.**  
BONHAM, August 12.—Col. Chas.  
DeMorse spoke here to-day. He  
says he is a Democrat of the good  
old backwoods school. He con-  
demned the Fourteenth Legisla-  
ture for not calling a Constitu-  
tional Convention, and for the Inter-  
national Railroad compromise act.  
The contest in this District is hot-  
ly contested by Culbertson and De-  
Morse. Both are actively engaged  
in the canvass.

**Beecher's Statement—He De-  
nounces Tilton.**  
NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—Beecher's  
statement opens thus: "Gentlemen  
of the Committee—In the state-  
ment addressed to the public July  
22, I gave explicit, comprehensive  
and solemn denial to the charges  
made by Theodore Tilton against  
me. That denial I now repeat and  
reaffirm. . . . Four years ago  
Theodore Tilton fell from one of the  
proudest chairs in America . . .  
and after a few months became the  
associate and representative of Vic-  
toria C. Woodhull and friend of her  
strange cause. By his follies he  
was bankrupt in reputation, occu-  
pation and resources. The interior  
history, of which I am now to give,  
shows his attempts to so employ  
me as to restore him in business, re-  
putation, and place him upon an em-  
inence from which he had fallen.  
It is a sad history, the full meaning  
of which I have recently divined."  
Beecher's denunciation of Tilton  
is terrible.

**Moulton's Statement Published—  
He Refuses to surrender the  
Letters.**  
NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—Moulton's  
statement before the Beecher in-  
vestigating committee, was published  
to-night. He refuses to surrender  
the letters entrusted to him in con-  
fidence, but will allow the commit-  
tee to examine the originals for the  
purpose of authenticating the por-  
tions quoted in Tilton's statement.  
A member of the committee was  
designated to make the examina-  
tion.

**The Cooper Case.**  
The editor of the Galveston  
Thieves, Own is responsible for the  
death of a young lady whom it had  
renorselessly slandered, and the  
lunacy of her brother, now confined  
in the Austin Asylum. The proof  
points to a conspiracy, in which  
BAKER, KER and WILSON of the  
Mercury, were prominent, to kid-  
nap and lynch young COOPER. The  
conspirators, dressed in women's  
clothes, got COOPER into a close  
carriage at night with the intention  
of mistreating, if not killing him,  
but he made his escape. In the me-  
lee one party was stabbed and killed  
by mistake. Not satisfied with an  
atrocious slander; which cost  
the life of the young lady, the con-  
spirators were guilty of the bloody  
drama costing the life of one of  
their number, and the lunacy of the  
brother. This is one of the most

fearful tragedies that has ever dis-  
graced the annals of civilization.  
And it all lies at the door of the  
Devil's Own, one BAKER, editor of  
the Houston Mercury. It is to be  
hoped that Col. FLOERNOY, who is  
working the case up will not only  
be able to convict BAKER of the il-  
legal but a conspiracy which should  
consign him to a felons cell at Hunts-  
ville. We believe the testimony  
published shows that he richly de-  
serves it. He is the most despe-  
rate and brazen carpet-bag villain  
that has ever dishonored our be-  
loved State.—State Gazette.

**LOCAL AFFAIRS.**

**THE EXECUTION.**—The day for the execution of Edward Jenkins, the negro convicted of murder in the first degree, having arrived, our reporter repaired to the jail this morning at 9 o'clock, and on entering the yard, found Jenkins sitting on a bench, a white handkerchief tied over his head; he was dressed in white linen pants and shirt. He appeared to be somewhat confused in mind at first, when spoken to, but in a few minutes afterwards our reporter asked him how he had slept the last few nights, upon which he calmly replied, "I do not wish to say anything more about the matter, I could not help it and feel satisfied to die an easy death, as I had no intention of killing Schroeder at the time; I once threw away my arms during the quarrel, and had Schroeder not used the words he did, and had the other men working there kept my arms away from me instead of giving them back to me while the dispute was going on, no fatal result could have ever come from it, but on feeling my arms again, I used them; I was so excited that I did not know whether I had a cane, crowbar, or what was in my hand, that's all."

Jenkins had a downcast appearance during the whole of the conversation; he got up from the bench, peeped through the keyhole of the entrance to the jailyard and went to his cell with keeper Schmidt, where his wife and family with the colored minister had been waiting and praying for him. After remaining there for some time, he was informed by Sheriff Bonnet, that he must now settle all his business. His time before departure was but very short, and that no one should come in to disturb him in his last prayer.

At five minutes to eleven o'clock, keepers Schmidt and Masch brought him from his cell when he went to the opposite corner of the yard from where the gallows were erected, he fell on the bench, apparently weak and fainting; stretching his legs and closing his eyes, he was spoken to several times by persons, but did not answer.

Precisely at 11 o'clock Jenkins was ceased by Sheriff Bonnet and keeper Schmidt and taken to the gallows, he sank to the floor and had to be dragged up the stairs. On the top of the platform he acted as if he had been drugged with some narcotic; efforts were made to put him on his feet, but of no avail. It was tried to seat him on a chair, but he fell from it also, stretching himself at full length across the trap.

Sheriff Bonnet then called on the physicians present, Drs. Gaenslen, Petersen, Chew and Paschal to examine him to see whether there was anything the matter with him; they done so and said he was all right.

Our reporter understood that two or three bottles of whisky had been smuggled to him in the morning, neither can it be ascertained that Jenkins was drunk, he might have been somewhat confused in mind, yet the prostration of nerves from the natural fear in such moments must prevent drunkenness to a great extent. It may be, however, that Jenkins was quite sensible fifteen minutes before his death, as our reporter observed.

Two ministers were in attendance and administered the last communion to Jenkins, upon which Sheriff Bonnet read the execution warrant and with the assistance of jailors Schmidt and Masch raised him up and put the black cap over his face, attached the rope to his neck and immediately after the fatal trap fell and he sawing into eternity.

He fell through the trap in a sitting position and his neck therefore could not have been broken, which, of course, caused a gradual strangulation. Had he been standing on his feet, he would have fallen five feet and died a great deal easier.

Jenkins was a robust negro of extraordinary strong limbs and muscles.

After the expiration of forty minutes the physicians were satisfied, that life was extinct; he was then cut down and his body handed over to his friends.

The Alamo Rifles were in attendance.

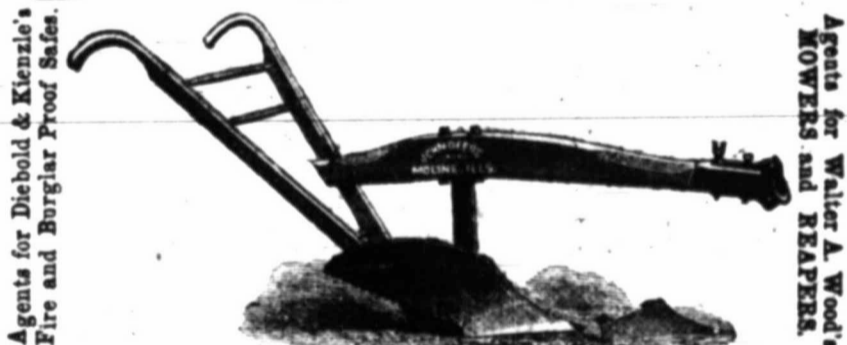

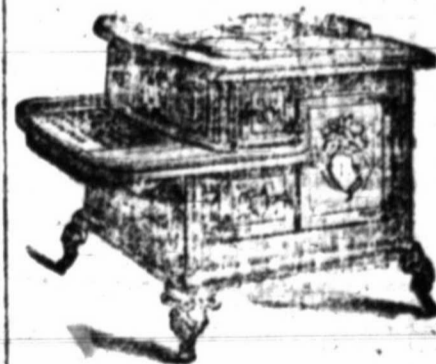
