Help for Bankroft's History.

London Correspondence N. Y Times. Lord dmund Fitzmaurice is brother to the present Marquis of Lansdowne, and the ancestor whose life he has begun writing was that famous Lord Shelburne, Minister to George III, of obstinate memory, and the man who settled the preliminaries of peace with certain revolted colonies, the independance of which was afterward acknow ledged under the now rather well known name of the United States of America. To the family papers Lord Edmund Fitzmaurice had access, and in the course of his resear. ches came upon a considerable number of autograph letters from the King to Lord Shelburne relating to the war of independence and the negotiations then going on. When he heard that Mr. Bancroft was in town he called upon him, told him of what be had discovered. and offered to place the whole of the manuscripts in Mr. Bancroft's hands, to make what use of he liked. Considering that the matter in question related to a war between England and America; that there is some dispute as to facts; that Lord Ed mund Fitzmaurice is an Englishman and Mr. Bancroft an American, each dealing with the same topic from his own point of view, it seems to me that the act of Lord Edmund Fitzmaurice was a singularly gracetul and generous one. There are not many handsomer things in literary history. STOCK WAR!

Mason County Under Arms - A Promised Revenge and Partial Execution.

Correspondence Fredericksburg Seutinel]

Mason, Texas, Aug. 18, 1874. On the ninth of August, 1874, John Clark, Sherift of Mason county, with a posse of 18 men, went after a set of cow hands of Al. Roberts, who had made a raid into Mason county and driven off 200 head of cattle.

Mr. Clark overtook the cow-raiders, eleven men, at Castell, Llane county, they having the 200 head in possession. When Mr. Clark informed them that he had come to arrest them they showed fight, but seeing the sheriff's posse was too large for them, they gave up, and were brought back to Mason and lodged in jail.

The cattle taken in charge by a part of

the posse were penned at Mr. Bower's.

During the night a party of the said Roberts commenced to shoot into the pen, and stampeded the cattle, thereby, as they thought, destroying the proof their guilt. Thursday, August 13, 1874, two of the defendants were tried upon the charge of driving out of Mason county 200 head of cattle without having them inspected. The evidence not sustaining the charges, they were discharged, and the time for trying the other nine was set for 9 o'clock Friday morning. Just as the court adjourned, there appeared a party of forty armed hands of the said Roberts from Llano and Burnet counties. John Baird, the leader, informed Wilson Hey, presiding justice of Mason county, trying the case, that they wanted to ball out the men in jail, and if they could not bail them out they intended to take them out. Judge Hey tuformed them that he would fix the

PASSED AT THE FIRST SESSION OF THE FOR TY-THIRD CONGRESS.

|GENERAL NATURE-No. 71. AN ACT to provide for the establishment of life-saving stations and houses of the fage upon the see and lake coasts of the United States, and o promote the efficiency of the life-saving service.

[Concluded.]

SEC. 5. That the Secretary of the Treas nry is hereby authorized to employ crews of experienced surfmen at such of the staherein denominated complete stations and at such of the life-boat statious on the Pacific coast as he may deem neces sary and proper, for such periods, and at such compensation, not to exceed forty dollars per month, as he may deem neces-sary and reasonable.

SEC. 6. That the Secretary of the Treasury may accept the services of volunteer crews of any of the life-boat stations herein authorized, who shall be subject to the rules and regulations governing the life-saving service; and a list of the names of each crew shall be kept in the office of the Secretary of the Treasury. Such volunteers shall receive no compensation except a sum of not more than ten deliars each for every occasion upon which they shall have been instrumental in saving human life, and such of the medals herein authorized as they may be entitled to under the provisions hereinafter made: Provided, That no payment shall be made to any person who shall not have actually participated in the efforts to save the lives res-

SEC. 7. That the Secretary of the Treasnry is hereby directed to cause to be pre-pared medals of honor, with suitable de-vices, to be distinguished as life-saving medals of the first and second class, which shall be bestowed upon any persons who shall bereafter endanger their own lives in saving, or endeavouring to save lives from perils of the sea, within the United States or upon any American vessel: Provided That the medal of the first class shall be confined to extreme and heroic daring; and that the medal of the second class shall be given in cases not sufficiently dis-tinguished to deserve the medal of the first class: Provided, also, That no award of either medal shall be made to any person until sufficient evidence of his deserving shall have been filed with the Secretary of the Treasury and entered uponthe records

of the Department.
SEC. 8. That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized to make all necessary regulations for the government of the life-saving service not inconsistent with

That the Secretary of the Treasury is bereby authorized to dispose of, to the best advantage, after due condemnation by board of survey, such articles or materials belonging to the life-saving ser-vice as may, from long continued use or other cause, become unserviceable and the proceeds of such sale shall be covered into

SEC. 10. That from and after the first day of July, eighteen hundred and seventy day of July, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, whenever any vessel of the United States has sustained or caused any acci-dent involving the loss of life, the mate-rial loss of property, or any serious injury to any person, or has received any material damage affecting her seaworthiness or her efficiency, the managing owner, agent, or master of such vessel shall, within five days after the happening of such accident or damage, or as soon thereafter as possi-ble, send, by letter to the collector of customs of the district wherein such vessel belongs or of that within which such accident or damage occurred, a report there-of, signed by such owner, agent, or master, stating the name and official number (if any) of the vessol, the port to which she belongs, the place where she was, the nature and probable eccasion of the casualty, the number and names of those lost and the estimated amount of loss or damage to the vessel or cargo; and shall furnish, upon the request of either of such collectors of customs, such other informathe casualty as may be called for; and if he neglect or refuse to comply with the foregoing requirements after a reasonable time, he shall incur a penalty of one hun-

dred dollars.
SEC. 11. That whenever the marraging wner or agent of any vessel of the United States has reason, owing to the non-appearance of such vessel, or to any other circumstance, to apprehend that such ves-sel has been lost, he shall as soon as conveniently may be, send notice, in writing. to the collector of customs of the port to which said vessel belonged, of such loss, and the probable occasion thereof stating the same and official number (if any) of the vessel, and the names of all persons on board, so far as the same can be ascertained, and shall furnish, upon request of the collector of such port, such additional information as he may be able; and if he neglect to comply with the above requirements within a reasonable time. he shall incur a penalty of one hundred dollars.

SEC. 12. That it shall be the duty of the collector of customs to immediatly transmit to the Secretary of the Treasury such reports and information as they may receive under the provisions of the two preceive under the provisions of the we pre-ceding sections, and they shall also report to the Secretary of the Treasury any neg lect or refusal on the part of the managing owner, agent, or master of any vessel of the United States to comply with the re-greening managements thereof.

quirements thereof.

SEC. 13. That the Secretary of the Treasury may, upon application therefor, remit or mitigate any penalty provided for in this act, or discontinue any prosecution to recover the same, upon such terms as he, in his discretion, shall think proper, and shall have anthority to ascertain the facts apon all such applications in such manner and under such regulations as he may think proper; all penaltics hereinbefore provided shall be prosecuted by indictment or information before the proper district court for the use of the United States.
