COL. JOHN L. HAYNES, Collector of the Port at Brownsville, who edits the *Ranchero*, tells the following good story on Mr. Schleicher. He and Col. Haynes were both Union members of the Legislature of 1860-61. But Mr. Schleicher could not stand the secession pressure, caved in, and tried to get Col. Haynes to go with him. The *Ranchero* says:

He came to my desk one day and said: "Look here, H., I want to tell you a story." "Very good, give us your story."

He then proceeded to tell us that he was once the fortunate owner of a dog of the bench legged pidge genus, an accomplished animal, a dog among a thousand. He was accustomed to send this valuable dog to market, with a note to the butcher, and the dog did his marketing as well as he could have done it himself. One morning he gave an order for sausages, of which he was very fond, and the order was duly filled and Bench-leg started home with the market basket. But on the road he encountered a lot of hungry curs that proposed to breakfast off those sausages. Bench-leg defended his charge, until he saw that the battle was lost, when he dived into the basket and filled his own belly with the sausages to the dismay of the hungry curs surrounding him. "Now H.," said our friend Myrheer Schleicher, "we have made the best fight we could, now let us pitch into this secession basket and eat sausage." We laughed very heartily at the story but declined to eat sausage. We were opposed on principle to that sort of sausage, and we are opposed on principle to those facile politicians who can eat sausage out of any basket that may offer, and we shall have to try to defeat our friend Schleicher, notwithstanding he is a clever gentleman with whom we are willing any day to drink *sweet lager*.

If any persons have doubts about the empty and deceitful words of politicians, let them look over a list of tax receipts on the same piece of property. They will find a gradual increase for the length of time they have preserved them. If they have preserved the platform of the several parties that have been in power while these taxes were voted and collected, they will find in every one of them a special plank in favor of reducing expenditures, and accordingly lessening rates of taxation.

The people want low taxes; they think they vote for them; but they find out the contrary when the tax gatherer makes his calls. Who ever heard of a party going into power pledging itself to increase the taxes of a state, county, town or school district? No one. It is always pledged to the contrary policy. But there is money in collecting taxes and in spending them, and for this end they are raised—raised in every sense of the word.—*Prairie Farmer.*

A CURIOUS commentary on popular elections is given by the Louisville Courier-Journal, the text being the number of votes cast for the various officers in an election in that city. There were computed to be only 19,110 legal voters in the city. There were 17,667 votes cast for jailor; 17,113 for clerk of the chancery court at Louisville; for sheriff of the county, 16,447; for city judge, 15,302; for judge of the court of appeals, the second highest office in the state, 12,467. It will be remarked that these offices stand in the order of their pecuniary value, and that the greater the fees or salaries, the larger was the number of votes cast.

THE REPUBLICAN MASS MEETING at the Turners' Hall on Saturday night last was well attended, notwithstanding the drizzling rain that was falling. The Hall was packed to almost its utmost capacity. Several prominent Democrats were to be seen in the audience. These things show that great interest has been awakened in this community by the Coke-Morgan, anti-fraud, anti-San Antonio, anti-frontier, anti-harbor improvement, monopoly nomination made at Goliad.

The meeting was called to order by Judge A. Siemerling, chairman of the county Republican Committee, who stated that the first business in order was the election of a President, whereupon, on motion, A. Dittmar, Esq., was elected, and was called to the chair. H. McCormack, Esq., was elected secretary. On motion a committee of five gentlemen was appointed by the chair to report the names of proper delegates to represent this county in the Republican Congressional Convention to meet in this city on the 9th inst.—next Wednesday. The committee consists of the following gentlemen: Geo. W. Brackneridge, Jas. Biggar, M. Goll, Fritz Rummel J. Westmoreland.

After considerable discussion, the meeting adjourned to meet at the same place on Monday night at 7 o'clock, when the committee is to report. They were, by motion, directed to select twenty-five names, including the names of the committee-men.

A large meeting is expected to-night.

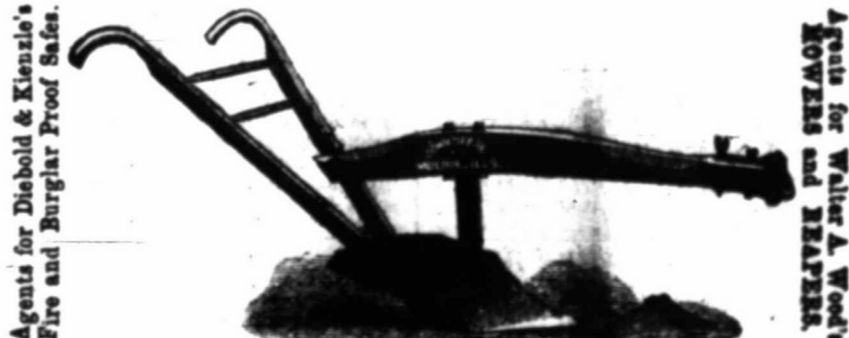
