MAJ. J. T. BRACKENRIDGE made a speech before the Goliad Convention, which we find in the *State Gazette*, and from which we make the following extract, and which contains good sound sense:

I hail from San Antonio, the place of my home, and there is not one interest in Western Texas, with which she is not identified. Unless we have protection on the frontier you destroy it and throw it back, and San Antonio will be vacated, fit for nothing but a goat rancho and the refuge of the abandoned and vicious. There is not an interest, no improvement on your harbors at Galveston, Indianola, Corpus Christi, or elsewhere but San Antonio has an interest in. And San Antonio too has an interest in every interest of Eastern Texas. It has built it up and all its wealth has been built up by her great stock interests. San Antonio imports a million of dollars for every thousand imported by every other city on the coast. We want mail facilities, and we think it the especial duty of her representatives to secure these objects for her. It is to be accomplished—not by speech making but in committees; it is done by log rolling, by getting men of influence to father your bill and to assist you in working it through. I have heard another question mooted too, and that is the advisability of a division of the State. Western Texas not having had her fair proportion of the benefits of international improvement accorded her by the State Government, I believe to day it would be the policy of the State Government to help the International, to assist the Texas Pacific and the Great Northern and Columbia railroads. I believe these railroads would give ample protection on the Mexican borders and would open the doors of emigration, so that the State would soon be great and prosperous. I believe that if these railroads were built the population of Western Texas would soon be equal to that of the whole State to day.

DEMOCRATIC ATROCITIES in the South are having their legitimate effect in the North, and all over the country. We copy below what is said by the *Courier-Journal*, the leading Democratic paper in the South. It is now becoming plain, in the South as well as in the North, that the peace of the country demands that the old secessionists shall never again get into power. The *Courier-Journal* says:

There was a chance that the next House of Representatives would not be Radical. That chance is gone. The outbreaks in Kentucky and the massacre in Tennessee settle that much. No people, no party, could stand under such a load as the people of the South and the Democratic party of the North are forced to carry. Call it what you will—the fruit of reconstruction, the fault of the party in power, the inevitable conflict of races, precipitated by a theory of government, executed in a vicious practice—the one effect of the whole mess of violence is a continuance and reinforcement of the old pretext by which the country has been carried along the same baleful, partisan rut ever since the war.

The Gibson county butchery surpasses belief; and, though the Governor of Tennessee has done his full duty, the gallows can alone render atonement commensurate with the public expectation. It is hardly likely that anybody is going to be hung. The result will be renewed legislation, additional Radical enactments—perhaps, ultimately, martial law.

A Man Murdered Last Night.

DALLAS, Sept. 3.—A saloon keeper, by the name of Victor Gold, who had a restaurant and saloon on the east side of the square, was murdered, about 2 o'clock last night, after closing his place of business, and while on his way home. Owen Mitchell, being suspected, was arrested by Deputy United States Marshal, Geo. Holland.

Mitchell was observed by Holland to come up to the deceased a few seconds after the flash and report of the pistol. It is supposed he was murdered for money, as his pockets were turned inside out. He was shot through the heart, and did not live long enough to give any clew

to the affair. A coroner's inquest was held this morning, but no evidence produced to convict the man Mitchell, only the circumstance of his presence so soon after the report of pistol being against him. The murdered man was a German, and formerly resided in New Orleans.

THE MASS MEETING of the Republicans of Bexar county, held last night at Karbo's Garden, was very interesting, harmonious, and successful. The grounds were covered, (and would have been shaded, had it been day-time,) with beautiful trees, and well provided with seats. The whole place was well lighted with torches. The stage was well fitted for such an occasion. And the audience was quite large, considering the darkness and mud, fully half of it being made of Democrats.

The meeting having been called to order by the chairman, A. Dittmar Esq., the Secretary, H. McCormack Esq., read the minutes of the preceding meeting on Saturday night last. The committee to select delegates to the Congressional Convention which meets to-morrow, was then called on to report. Geo. W. Brackenridge Esq., chairman of the Committee, in handing in the report, said that they had selected more names than were ordered by the convention, because they want the help of several prominent gentlemen not included in the regular list. After some discussion, in which Mr. Huston and Mr. McCormack objected to the selection of any names but those of undoubted Republicans, and Col. Gillespie and Mr. Biggar defended the course of the committee, the report was harmoniously adopted.

Mr. Siemerling then called upon Hon. Edward Degner to inform the meeting whether or not he would be a candidate before the Convention for the nomination. Mr. Degner then took the stand, and in an able, eloquent, and thoroughly digested speech, of over an hour, declared himself a candidate, with certain conditions. The speech of Mr. Degner was statesmanlike, liberal, and conciliatory, and gave great satisfaction to all parties; so much so that availability is the only question upon which the acceptance of his candidacy by the Convention will turn.
