#### Sunday Dispatches.

**King Alfonso.**—The great Powers have authorized their representatives at Madrid to enter into negotiations with the new government.

**Ex-King of the Two Sicilies.**—The King of the Two Sicilies has visited Alfonso and assured him Counts Caserta and Marsi will withdraw from the Carlist cause.

**The Spanish Fleet.**—Consisting of three iron clads will arrive at Madrid tomorrow.

**King Alfonso, leaves Paris.**—At 5 P. M. Alfonso left Paris for Madrid.

**Washington, Jan. 6.**—Vice-President Withers proposes in his annual message to New Orleans, and thinks it a death blow to the Republican party.

**New York, Jan. 6.**—The sale of the Plymouth Church pews averaged 70,000 against 55,000 last year; highest price \$600, lowest \$150.

**New York, Jan. 6.**—The Times is an editorial on Louisiana affairs says: "For ourselves we must say that the use which was made of U. S. troops seemed to have been an extreme exercise of power, one for which the President, who is principally responsible for it, must find it very difficult to show the authority that the United States guarantees to each State a Republic can form or government, and on requisition, protection against domestic violence. In this case was no recent requisition, and there was no actual violence. The Governor called in troops in anticipation of his own helplessness, and engaged their commander in acts which have never yet been performed by a U. S. army officer. The troops did not aid the State forces, but they replaced them. We do not believe the country will regard such proceedings with approval if it does the consequences President Grant's military intervention and interference have taken place."
